"Lord I Call..." Tone 1

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!

Tone 1 (for the Resurrection)

Ac<u>cept</u> our evening prayers, O <u>ho</u>ly Lord! Grant us re<u>mis</u>sion of sins,// for You alone have manifested the Resur<u>rec</u>tion to the world.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Encircle Zion and surround her, O people!
Give glory in her to the One Who rose from the dead!
For He is our God,//
Who has delivered us from our transgressions!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Come, O people, let us hymn and fall down before Christ, glorifying His Resurrection from the dead! For He is our God,//
Who has delivered the world from the Enemy's deceit!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Tone 6 *Idiomela (for the Forerunner, by John the Monk)*

During the celebration of shameless Herod's <u>birth</u>day, the terms of the oath to the wanton <u>dancer</u> were fulfilled, for the Baptist's head was cut off and carried like food on a <u>plat</u>ter in the presence of those reclining at the loathsome <u>banquet</u>. Truly they feasted on wickedness and <u>mur</u>der. But let us bless the <u>Fore</u>runner as is his due,// and honor him as the greatest born of <u>wo</u>men!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

For the sake of an oath to a <u>dancing girl</u>, you delivered his holy head to that <u>Jezebel</u>. Woe to you! How did you dare such <u>mur</u>der? Why was the wanton dancer not con<u>sumed</u> by fire? But let us bless the <u>Bap</u>tist as is his due,// and honor him as the greatest born of women!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Again Herodias raves with <u>raging</u> lust.
Oh, dance of deceit and feast of <u>mur</u>der!
The Baptist is beheaded, and Herod is <u>trou</u>bled.//

Tone 1 *Idiomela (for the Forerunner, by Patriarch Germanos)*

What shall we call you, O <u>Proph</u>et? Angel, apostle, <u>mar</u>tyr? <u>Angel</u>, for you have spent your life like those who have no <u>body</u>. Apostle, for you have <u>taught</u> the <u>na</u>tions, and <u>mar</u>tyr, for your head has been cut off for the <u>sake</u> of Christ.// Pray to Him then that our souls may be granted great <u>mer</u>cy!

Let us <u>cel</u>ebrate the memorial of the beheading of the <u>Fore</u>runner; at that time you gushed forth blood upon the <u>plat</u>ter,// and now you pour forth healing to the <u>ends</u> of the earth!

To<u>day</u> the mother of <u>mur</u>der, acting with more wickedness than has <u>ev</u>er been seen, has roused to <u>ev</u>il her utterly wanton <u>daughter</u> against the divinely-chosen and greatest of <u>all</u> the <u>Proph</u>ets. For while hateful <u>Her</u>od was celebrating his ungodly <u>birth</u>day, she contrived according to the oath he had given her for her <u>dancing</u>, to <u>beg</u> for the precious head of the <u>her</u>ald of God that <u>gushed</u> forth <u>mir</u>acles.

And <u>he</u>, in his madness, fulfilled his <u>promise</u> and gave it to her as reward for her brazen <u>dancing</u>. But the in<u>it</u>iate of the <u>coming</u> of Christ ceased not after death to rebuke them for their re<u>pul</u>sive <u>un</u>ion, but reproved them loudly, <u>say</u>ing:

"It does not become you to commit adultery with the wife of you brother <u>Philip</u>." Oh, <u>birth</u>day, killer of <u>proph</u>ets!

Oh, banquet full of blood!

Let <u>us</u>, arrayed in white, piously celebrate the Beheading of the <u>Fore</u>runner, and rejoice on this day as on a <u>great</u> feast!

And let us <u>ask</u> the Forerunner to beseech the <u>Trin</u>ity for us,// that we be delivered from dishonorable passions, and that our souls be saved!

Tone 4 *(for the Forerunner)*

Herod's birthday celebration was a lawless and shameful feast,

for, spellbound by feminine licentiousness

and stricken with madness by a woman's wantonness,

he cut off the head of the Forerunner;

but he did not cut out the Prophet's tongue, which had de<u>nounced</u> his foolishness.

Spilling innocent blood, he wished to conceal a <u>law</u>less sin;

but he could not stop the voice of one who called all to repentance.

He joined in taking delight in murder,

but let us join in celebrating with love the blessed slaying of John the <u>Bap</u>tist; for he was in hell in anticipation

to proclaim to those who sat in darkness and in the <u>shad</u>ow of death

the Life, the <u>Day</u>spring from on high,//

Christ our God, Who alone is rich in mercy.

Come, O people,

let us praise the Prophet and Martyr and Baptist of the <u>Sav</u>ior!

For being an <u>angel</u> in the flesh, he thoroughly reproved <u>Her</u>od

by condemning his act of unlawful a<u>dul</u>tery;

and through the impious dance, he endured the cutting off of his precious head,

that he might proclaim to those in hell

the good news of the Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the dead;//

and he earnestly intercedes with the Lord, that our souls may be saved.

Come, O faithful,

Let us praise the Prophet, and Martyr, and Baptist of the <u>Sav</u>ior!

Living in <u>ex</u>ile, he dwelt in the <u>wil</u>derness,

eating wild honey and locusts;

and he reproved the king who transgressed the Law.

But he comforted our faintheartedness by saying://

"Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand!"

Tone 5 *(for the Forerunner, by John the Monk)*

<u>Her</u>od, intending to escape reproaches for his sinful <u>do</u>ings, gave your head, O Forerunner, to a lawless woman.

For the <u>wretch</u> did not understand that by offering it on a platter he was condemning himself.

But as <u>teach</u>er of purity and guide to redeeming repentance, O <u>Bap</u>tist,//intercede with Christ to deliver us from the disgrace of <u>passions!</u>

now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 5 (*Theotokion, from the Dormition*)

<u>Sing</u>, O people! Sing the praises of the <u>Moth</u>er of our God; for today she delivers her <u>soul</u>, full of light, into the <u>hands</u> of Him Who became incarnate of her with<u>out</u> seed. And she en<u>treats</u> Him without <u>ceasing</u>// to grant the earth <u>peace</u> and great <u>mer</u>cy.

Tone 1 *(for the Resurrection)*

We have been <u>freed</u> from <u>sufferings</u> by Your <u>suffering</u>, O Christ.

<u>We</u> have been delivered from cor<u>rup</u>tion by Your <u>Res</u>ur<u>rec</u>tion.//
O Lord, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Let creation rejoice!
Let the heavens be glad!
Let the nations clap their hands with gladness, for Christ our Savior has nailed our sins to the Cross. Slaying death, He has given life.//
He has resurrected fallen Adam as the Lover of man.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

As <u>King</u> of <u>heav</u>en and earth,
You were voluntarily crucified in Your <u>love</u> for man.

<u>Hell</u> was angered when it <u>met</u> You below.

Tone 8 *(for the Forerunner)*

O <u>Fore</u>runner of the <u>Sav</u>ior, you rebuked kings so that they would not work in<u>iq</u>uity; but the frolicking of a lawless woman persuaded <u>Her</u>od to cut <u>off</u> your head. Therefore we bless your name from the rising to the <u>set</u>ting of the sun. Since you stand with <u>bold</u>ness before the Lord,// earnestly entreat Him to save our souls!

Tone 8 (*Theotokion*)

O un<u>wed</u>ded <u>Virgin</u>, who ineffably conceived <u>God</u> in the flesh, O <u>Mother of God</u> most high, accept the cries of your servants, O <u>blame</u>less One! Grant cleansing of trans<u>gres</u>sions to all!// Receive our prayers and pray to <u>save</u> our souls!

Let <u>Hero</u>dias lament, for she entreated lawless <u>mur</u>der, loving not the Law of God, nor <u>eternal life</u>,// but that which is <u>false</u> and <u>temporal</u>.

Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us /as we have set our hope on You! (Ps. 32:22)
