18th Sunday after Pentecost (5th of Luke) Martyr Arethas and 4,299 Martyrs with him

"Lord I Call..." Tone 1

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

Be glad, O heavens!
Sound trumpets, O foun<u>da</u>tions of the earth!
Sing in <u>glad</u>ness, O <u>moun</u>tains!
Behold Emmanuel has <u>nailed</u> our <u>sins</u> to the Cross!
Granting <u>life</u>, He has <u>slain</u> death.//
He has resurrected Adam as the Lover of man.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Let us praise Him

Who voluntarily was crucified in the <u>flesh</u> for our sake.

He <u>suf</u>fered, was buried, but <u>rose</u> from the dead.

By Orthodoxy confirm Your Church, O Christ.//

Grant peace for our life as the gracious <u>Lov</u>er of man.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

We <u>stand</u> before Your life-bearing tomb unworthily, O <u>Christ</u> God, offering glory to Your ineffable com<u>pas</u>sion. You have ac<u>cept</u>ed the Cross and death, O <u>sin</u>less One// to grant Resurrection to the world as the Lover of man.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Let us praise the Word,

co-eternal with the <u>Fa</u>ther.

He in<u>eff</u>ably came forth from the <u>virg</u>inal womb.

He freely accepted the <u>Cross</u> and <u>death</u> for our sake.

He was <u>raised</u> in <u>glory</u>.//

Glory to You, O lifegiving Lord, the Savior of our souls!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 1 (for St. Arethas) (O all-praised martyrs)

You <u>set</u> your courage, O most praised Martyr A<u>re</u>thas, against the savagery of <u>e</u>vil men.

By the <u>grace</u> of God, you were shown to be vic<u>tor</u>ious.

O glorious <u>one</u>, you <u>brought</u> to Christ//
a choir of martyrs formed by soldiers of all ages and <u>races</u>.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

You <u>formed</u> a beautiful choir, O most glorious A<u>re</u>thas, of your holy fellow <u>mar</u>tyrs.

You <u>struggled</u> together with them, completing the <u>good</u> race and the good fight of your cou<u>rageous contest.</u>//
Therefore entreat Christ that He may grant our souls peace and great <u>mer</u>cy!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

The godly-<u>mind</u>ed virgin <u>mar</u>tyrs, enkindled by the <u>love</u> of Christ, did not <u>heed</u> the weakness of their <u>na</u>ture. Manifestly <u>strength</u>ened by the <u>power</u> of God they trampled <u>down</u> the delusion of the <u>enemy</u>. They were not afraid of the pain of <u>tor</u>ture// and did not fear the fiery <u>fur</u>nace.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 4 (for St. Arethas, by Anatolius)

Today, united in mind and singing hymns of praise, O <u>faithful</u>, let us honor the glorious chief shepherd Arethas and his com<u>panions</u>. When he de<u>nounced</u> the evil one and shed his blood in con<u>fession</u> of Christ, a pillar of fire consumed the <u>face</u> of the earth in reproof of the enemy's un<u>god</u>liness. Therefore, O Christ God, as You strengthened the athletes for Your <u>glory</u>, by the <u>prayers</u> of Your saints, preserve us also from temptations and tribu<u>lations</u>,// for You are the <u>Mas</u>ter of all!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Let creation rejoice!
Let the <u>heavens</u> be glad!
Let the <u>nations</u> clap their hands with <u>gladness</u>, for Christ our Savior has <u>nailed</u> our <u>sins</u> to the Cross. Slaying <u>death</u>, He has given <u>life</u>.//
He has resurrected fallen Adam as the <u>Lover</u> of man.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

As <u>King</u> of <u>heaven</u> and earth,
