SUNDAY, MAY 19 3rd Sunday of Pascha, Holy Myrrhbearing Women

TONE 2

"Lord I Call..." Tone 2

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sacrifice!//</u> Hear me, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your name!

Tone 2 *(for the Resurrection)*

Come, let us worship the <u>Word</u> of God begotten of the Father before all <u>ages</u>, and in<u>car</u>nate of the Virgin <u>Mary</u>! Having en<u>dured</u> the Cross, He was buried as He Him<u>self</u> desired.// And having risen from the dead, He saved me, an <u>er</u>ring man.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

Christ our Savior

nailed to the Cross the bond against us, He <u>voided</u> it and destroyed the do<u>min</u>ion of death.// We fall down before His Resurrection on the third day.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

With the Archangels let us praise the Resur<u>rec</u>tion of Christ! He is our <u>Sav</u>ior, our Re<u>deem</u>er. He is coming with awesome glory and mighty <u>pow</u>er// to judge the world which He made.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

The Angel proclaimed You,

the crucified and buried Master.

He told the women: "Come, see the place where He lay!

He is <u>ris</u>en as He said,

for He is almighty."

We worship You, O only immortal One.//

Have mercy on us, O Christ, the Giver of life!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 2 (from the Pentecostarion, by Anatolius)

Early in the morning,

the myrrhbearing women brought spices to the <u>tomb</u> of the Lord.

They <u>found</u> the stone unexpectedly <u>rolled</u> away,

and they <u>asked</u> among themselves:

"Where are the <u>seals</u> of the tomb?

Where are Pilate's guards?"

The radiant Angel came to the wondering women and pro<u>claimed</u> to them:

"Why do you seek with tears the Life Who gives life to the <u>hu</u>man race?

Christ our God has risen from the dead as almighty,//

granting us incorruption, life, enlightenment, and great mercy!"

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

O women disciples,

why do you mingle myrrh with your tears?

The stone is gone; the tomb is empty.

Behold, corruption destroyed by life!

The seals witness that the guards of the godless have watched in vain.

Mortal <u>na</u>ture has been saved by the <u>flesh</u> of God.

Hell is wailing.

Go with joy, and proclaim to the Apostles:

"Christ has slain death as the first-born of the dead.//

He awaits you in Galilee!"

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

The Myrrhbearers came early to Your tomb, O Christ, seeking You to anoint Your most pure Body. Enlightened by the Angel's words, they proclaimed joyous tidings to the Apostles: "The Leader of our salvation has been raised; He has captured death,// granting the world eternal life and great mercy!"

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 1 *(from the Pentecostarion)*

"O <u>myrrh</u>bearing <u>wom</u>en, why have you <u>come</u> to the grave? <u>Why</u> do you seek the <u>Liv</u>ing among the dead?// The Lord is risen, take courage!" cried the <u>Ang</u>el.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

The <u>wom</u>en came with <u>fear</u> to the tomb, hastening to anoint Your Body with sweet <u>spices</u>. Not <u>find</u>ing it, they were perplexed and questioned one an<u>oth</u>er, as they did not know of Your <u>Re</u>sur<u>rec</u>tion. But an <u>Angel</u> appeared to <u>them</u> and said://
"Christ is risen, granting us great <u>mercy</u>."

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Mary <u>Mag</u>dalene and the other Mary went to the tomb, <u>seeking</u> the Lord. They saw an Angel, who shone like lightning, <u>sit</u>ting on the stone. And he <u>said</u> to them: "Why do you seek the living a<u>mong</u> the dead? He is <u>risen</u>, <u>as</u> He said; in <u>Gal</u>ilee you will <u>find</u> Him." Let us cry <u>out</u> to Him://
"O Lord, risen from the dead, <u>glo</u>ry to You!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(from the Pentecostarion)*

The myrrhbearing women <u>reached</u> Your tomb and saw the seals of the tomb <u>broken</u>.

Not finding Your most pure Body, they lamented, <u>say</u>ing: "Who has <u>stolen</u> our hope?

Who has taken the dead One, naked and a<u>nointed</u>, the sole consolation of His <u>Mother?</u>

How can the Life of the <u>dead</u> have died?

How can the Capturer of hell have been <u>buried?</u>//

But arise in three days as You said, O Savior, and <u>save</u> our souls!"

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 2 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The shadow of the Law passed when grace came; as the Bush burned, yet was not consumed, so the <u>Virgin</u> gave birth, yet remained a <u>Virgin</u>. The Righteous Sun has risen instead of a <u>pillar</u> of flame.// Instead of Moses, Christ, the Salvation of our souls.

Note:

According to the Typikon, when Vespers is served alone, there is no Litya and the stichera at "Lord, I Call" are: four stichera of the Resurrection: "Come, let us worship,..." "Christ our Savior..." "With the Archangels..." "The Angel proclaimed You..." followed by three from the Feast at "Lord, I Call": "Early in the morning..." "O women disciples..." "The Myrrhbearers came early..." and these three stichera taken from the Litya: "O myrrhbearing women..." "The women came with fear..." and "Mary Magdalene and the other Mary..."

Aposticha

Tone 2 *(for the Resurrection)*

Your Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, has enlightened the whole <u>u</u>niverse, re<u>call</u>ing Your creation.// Glory to You, O al<u>mighty</u> Lord!

(Then the Paschal Stichera with their verses from Psalm 67)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 5 *(from the Pentecostarion)*

Joseph, together with Nicodemus, took You down from the Tree, Who <u>clothe</u> Yourself with light as with a <u>gar</u>ment. He gazed on Your body - dead, naked, and un<u>bur</u>ied, and, in grief and tender compassion, he lamented: "Woe is me, my sweetest Jesus! A short while ago, the sun beheld You hanging on the Cross, and it hid itself in <u>dark</u>ness. The earth quaked in fear at the sight. The veil of the Temple was torn in two. Lo, now I see You willingly submit to death for our sake. How shall I bury You, O my God? How can I wrap You in a shroud? How can I touch Your most pure **Body** with my hands? What <u>songs</u> can I sing for Your exodus, O compassionate One? I magnify Your Passion. I glorify Your burial, and Your holy Resurrection, crying, 'O Lord, glory to You!""

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

(Then the remainder of Paschal Stichera with their verses from Psalm 67)

"Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death, and upon those in the tombs bestowing life!" (once)

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 2 Troparion (Resurrection)

When You de<u>scend</u>ed to death, O Life Im<u>mor</u>tal, You slew hell with the splendor of Your <u>God</u>head. And <u>when</u> from the depths You <u>raised</u> the dead, all the powers of <u>heav</u>en cried out://
"O Giver of life, Christ our <u>God</u>, glory to You!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

Tone 2 Troparion (Pentecostarion)

The <u>no</u>ble <u>Jo</u>seph, when he had taken down Your most pure <u>Body</u> from the Tree, <u>wrapped</u> it in fine linen and anointed it with <u>spices</u>, and placed it in a <u>new</u> tomb.

But You <u>rose</u> on the <u>third</u> day, O Lord,// granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mer</u>cy.

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 2 Troparion (Pentecostarion)

Tone 2 Troparion (*Pentecostarion*)

The <u>no</u>ble <u>Jo</u>seph, when he had taken down Your most pure <u>Body</u> from the Tree, <u>wrapped</u> it in fine linen and anointed it with <u>spices</u>, and placed it in a <u>new</u> tomb.

But You <u>rose</u> on the <u>third</u> day, O Lord,// granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mer</u>cy.

Tone 2 Troparion (*Pentecostarion*)

The <u>Ang</u>el came to the myrrhbearing women at the <u>tomb</u> and said: "Myrrh is <u>fit</u>ting for the dead; but <u>Christ</u> has shown Himself a stranger to cor<u>rup</u>tion! So proclaim: 'The Lord is <u>risen</u>,// granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mer</u>cy.'"

Tone 2 Kontakion (Pentecostarion)

You com<u>mand</u>ed the Myrrhbearers to rejoice, O <u>Christ</u> God. By Your Resurrection, You stopped the lamentation of Eve, the first <u>moth</u>er. You com<u>mand</u>ed them to preach to Your A<u>pos</u>tles://
"The Savior is risen from the tomb!"

Tone 8 Kontakion (*Pascha*)

You descended <u>in</u>to the <u>tomb</u>, O Im<u>mor</u>tal, You de<u>stroyed</u> the <u>power</u> of death. In victory <u>You arose</u>, O <u>Christ</u> God, proclaiming: "Rejoice!" <u>to</u> the Myrrhbearing <u>Wo</u>men,// granting peace to Your Apostles, and bestowing Resurrection on the fallen.

Tone 6 Prokeimenon

O Lord, save Your people, / and bless Your inheritance! (Ps. 27:9a)

V. To You, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent to me! (Ps. 27:1a)

Tone 8

Alleluia, Alleluia!
