### 21st Sunday after Pentecost, St. Gregory the Wonderworker of Neo-Caesarea

#### "Lord I Call..." Tone 4

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> up<u>on</u> You!// Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name! V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

### **Tone 4** (for the Resurrection)

We glorify Your Resurrection on the third day, O <u>Christ God</u>, by always honoring Your <u>life-creating Cross</u>; by <u>it</u>, You have renewed the corrupted <u>na</u>ture of man, O al<u>mighty One</u>.

By it, You have renewed our <u>en</u>trance to <u>hea</u>ven,// for You are good and the Lover of man.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

You loosed the Tree's verdict of disobedience, O <u>Sav</u>ior, by being voluntarily nailed to the <u>tree</u> of the Cross. By de<u>scending</u> to hell, O al<u>mighty</u> God, You broke the <u>bonds</u> of death. Therefore, we adore Your Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, <u>singing</u> in joy:// "Glory to You, O all <u>pow</u>erful Lord!"

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

You smashed the gates of <u>hell</u>, O Lord, and by Your death You demolished the <u>king</u>dom of death. You de<u>livered</u> the race of men from cor<u>ruption</u>,// granting the world life, incorruption and great <u>mer</u>cy.

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

Come, O <u>peo</u>ple, let us sing of the Savior's Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day! By <u>it</u>, we have been freed from the unbreakable <u>bonds</u> of hell. By it, we have received life and incor<u>rup</u>tion. Save us by Your <u>Res</u>ur<u>rec</u>tion!// O Life-creating and almighty Savior, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Angels and men sing of Your Resurrection on the third day, O <u>Sav</u>ior. By it, the ends of the earth have been il<u>lu</u>mined. By <u>it</u> we have been delivered from bondage to the <u>En</u>emy. Save us by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion!//
O Life-creating and almighty Savior, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

**V.** (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

You have shattered the <u>gates</u> of brass and destroyed the chains of death, O <u>Christ</u> God. You have <u>raised</u> the fallen <u>hu</u>man race.// O Lord, risen from the dead, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

### **Tone 8** (for St. Gregory) (What shall we call you)

What shall we call you, O Gregory?

Master, for you subjected the passions to your mind?

Husbandman, for you reaped the fruit of wisdom?

One granted the vision of God and taught with heavenly theology, a sacred performer of the mysteries, and most wondrous worker of miracles?//

Pray that our souls may be saved!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

What shall we now call you, O Gregory? Mighty destroyer of godless impiety, setting forth the laws of true worship? Wise teacher and bestower of invincible peace? Unvanquished conqueror of armies? One who ever dwells in the mountains, beholding those living in the cities?// Pray that our souls may be saved!

**V.** (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

What shall we now proclaim you, O <u>ven</u>erable one? You followed the Apostles as a worker of <u>mir</u>acles, and restrained the <u>river</u> by <u>calling</u> on Christ, drying up the lake which was the cause of contention between <u>brothers</u>. You dispersed the ungodly congregation, increasing and enlightening <u>Christian assemblies</u>.// Pray that our <u>souls</u> may be saved!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

### **Tone 6** (for St. Gregory)

Most wisely did you embark upon the depths of knowledge, O <u>hi</u>erarch of Christ.

You acquired the vision of the <u>Trinity</u>, foreseeing steadfastly in the Spirit of <u>Christ</u> our God. You poured forth on us a flood of <u>miracles</u>, making solid the watery <u>na</u>ture of the sea, changing the pagan priest's dark de<u>lusion</u> to belief. You persuaded the persecutors <u>truly</u> to believe, revealing yourself to them as a pillar of <u>vir</u>tue. You were called a prophet through your <u>miracles</u>. Therefore we be<u>seech</u> you,// ever pray for us to the Savior that our souls may be saved!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

### **Tone 4** (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The Prophet David was a <u>fa</u>ther of the Lord through you, O <u>Virgin</u>.

He fore<u>told</u> in songs the One Who worked <u>won</u>der in you:

"At Your right hand <u>stood</u> the Queen,"

Your Mother, the medi<u>atrix</u> of life,
since God was freely born of her without a <u>fa</u>ther.

He wanted to renew His fallen image, made corrupt in <u>passion</u>,
so He took the lost sheep up<u>on</u> His <u>shoul</u>der
and brought it to His <u>Fa</u>ther,
joining it to the <u>heav</u>enly pow'rs.//
Christ, Who has great and rich mercy, has saved the world, O Theotokos.

## **Tone 4** *(for the Resurrection)*

By ascending the <u>Cross</u>, O Lord, You have annulled our an<u>ces</u>tral curse. By de<u>scending</u> to hell, You have freed the eternal <u>pris</u>oners, granting incorruption to the <u>hu</u>man race.// Therefore in songs we glorify Your life-creating and saving Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

**V**. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

By hanging upon the tree, O only <u>pow</u>erful Lord, You shook all of creation.

By being <u>laid</u> in the tomb You have raised those who <u>dwelt</u> in the tombs, granting life and incorruption to the <u>human race.//</u>

Therefore in songs we glorify Your rising on the <u>third</u> day.

**V**. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

The lawless <u>people</u>, O Christ, handed You over to Pilate, condemned to be <u>cru</u>cified, thus <u>prov</u>ing themselves ungrateful before their <u>Ben</u>efactor. But voluntarily You endured <u>bur</u>ial, rising by Your own power on the <u>third</u> day as God,//granting us life everlasting and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

With tears the women <u>reached</u> Your tomb, searching for You, but not <u>finding</u> You.
They <u>wept</u> with wailing and la<u>mented</u>:
"Woe to us! Our Savior, <u>King</u> of all,
<u>how</u> were You <u>sto</u>len?
What place can hold Your life-bearing <u>body</u>?"
An Angel re<u>plied</u> to them:
"Do not weep, but go and proclaim that the <u>Lord</u> is <u>ris</u>en,//granting us joy as the only com<u>passionate One!"</u>

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

## **Tone 6** *(for St. Gregory)*

The watchfulness of God was given to you, O <u>wise</u> one, as it was to Daniel the <u>Prophet</u>; for, as a dream was re<u>vealed</u> to him, so the mystery of the faith was dis<u>closed</u> to you.//
Therefore, O venerable Father, pray that our <u>souls</u> may be saved!

#### **Tone 6** (*Theotokion*)

My Maker and Redeemer, <u>Christ</u> the Lord, was born of you, O most pure <u>Virgin</u>. By accepting my nature, He freed Adam from his <u>an</u>cient curse. Unceasingly we magnify you as the <u>Moth</u>er of God! Rejoice, O ce<u>les</u>tial Joy! Rejoice, O <u>La</u>dy://
the Protection, Intercession and Sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls!

### (at Great Vespers)

### **Tone 4** Troparion (Resurrection)

When the women disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the joyous message of Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, they cast away the an<u>ces</u>tral curse and elatedly told the a<u>pos</u>tles:
"<u>Death</u> is overthrown!
Christ God is <u>risen</u>,//
granting the world great <u>mer</u>cy!"

### Tone 8 Troparion (St. Gregory)

You became <u>wor</u>thy of your <u>name</u>\* through your <u>way</u> of life; through your vigilance in <u>prayer</u> and your <u>con</u>stant works of <u>mer</u>cy. Therefore, O Father <u>Gregory</u>, beseech <u>Christ</u> God to en<u>light</u>en our minds,//that we may not <u>sleep</u> in <u>sin</u>, which <u>leads</u> to death!

#### **Tone 8** Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion

For our sake You were <u>born</u> of <u>the Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fix</u>ion, O <u>Good</u> One, destroying <u>death</u> by death.

Revealing the <u>Resurrection</u> as God, do not despise the <u>work</u> of Your hand!

Reveal Your <u>love</u> for <u>man</u>, O Merciful One, and accept the Theotokos <u>pray</u>ing for us,//

and save the despairing people, O our Savior!
