22nd Sunday after Pentecost (10th of Luke) Afterfeast of the Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple Greatmartyr Catherine of Alexandria

"Lord I Call..." Tone 5

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

<u>Let my prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sacrifice!//</u> Hear me, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 5 *(for the Resurrection)*

By Your <u>pre</u>cious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, You have put the <u>dev</u>il to shame. By Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, You have blunted the <u>sting</u> of sin and <u>saved</u> us from the <u>gates</u> of death.// We glorify You, O <u>on</u>ly begotten One.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

<u>Christ</u> was led as a sheep to the <u>slaughter</u> in order to grant Resurrection to the <u>human race</u>. The <u>princes</u> of hell were <u>fright</u>ened by this, for the <u>gates</u> of sorrow were <u>lifted</u>. Christ the King of glory had <u>en</u>tered, <u>say</u>ing to those in <u>chains</u>: "Go forth!"// And to those in <u>darkness</u>: "<u>Come</u> to the light!"

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

O great wonder!

The Creator of the invisible suffered in the flesh in His <u>love</u> for man and <u>rose</u> again im<u>mor</u>tal.

Come, O sons of nations,

let us worship Him,

for delivered from error by His compassion,//

we have learned to sing of one <u>God</u> in three <u>Persons!</u>

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

We <u>of</u>fer You our evening <u>wor</u>ship,

O never setting Light,

Who <u>came</u> in these last days to the <u>world</u> in the flesh;

Who even descended to hell to dispel its darkness.

Who has revealed the light of Resurrection to the <u>na</u>tions.//

Glory to You, O Lord and Giver of light!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 1 (for the Feast) (Joy of the Heavenly Hosts)

<u>Come</u>, all who love the <u>feasts</u> of the Church! Let us honor the only pure Theotokos and Virgin with hymns!

for she is <u>led</u> into the <u>Tem</u>ple of God

now to live there in splendor.

She is indeed the most holy temple of Christ//

and the mediator of all our joy.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

O Prophet, throw open the doors!

Receive with faith the boast and radiant joy of <u>Angels</u> and men!

She is to be brought into the Temple of the Lord,

that there she may live and dance,//

for she is the temple and the abode of God.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

The Theotokos Mary is brought into the <u>Temple</u>, receiving bread from the Angel who appeared and <u>cried</u> to her: "Rejoice, for you shall conceive a Son without <u>knowing</u> a man!" O blessed Virgin Theotokos, <u>Bride</u> of God,//you are the good inheritance and restoration of <u>mor</u>tal men.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 1 (for St. Catherine) (Joy of the Heavenly Hosts)

To<u>day</u> the city of Alexandria adorns itself with wisdom, O <u>Mar</u>tyr, having your childhood garments within your holy <u>tem</u>ple. <u>There</u>fore, O Catherine, we also celebrate in reverence your honored <u>mem</u>ory.// Pray for those who <u>hon</u>or you!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

To<u>day</u> let us celebrate the memory of <u>Cath</u>erine, for by great word and deed she truly trampled all the <u>pow</u>ers of the foe and the oppo<u>si</u>tion of the <u>or</u>ators.//
By her prayers, O God, deliver us from the godless <u>enemy!</u>

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Rejoice, most glorious and honored Martyr <u>Catherine</u>, for the mountain of <u>Si</u>nai where <u>Mo</u>ses beheld the bush that burned yet was <u>not</u> consumed now keeps your <u>God</u>-pleasing <u>body</u>, tran<u>slated</u> there by the gracious <u>mer</u>cy of Christ// awaiting the time of His second <u>coming!</u>

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 2 (for St. Catherine)

All who love the martyrs,

let us hasten joyfully to the feast of the divinely-wise Martyr <u>Catherine!</u>

Let us <u>crown</u> her with praises as with flowers, crying <u>out</u> to her:

"Rejoice, for you denounced the insolence of foolish orators filled with <u>ig</u>norant thoughts

and led them to the divine Faith!

Rejoice, for you gave your body over to torments for love of your Creator and were <u>not</u> destroyed,

for you were an invincible woman!

Rejoice, for you have inherited the mansions on high

as the reward for your struggles!"

Now you delight in eternal glory.//

Desiring this glory, may we who hymn you not lose our <u>hope</u> in it!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 5 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

In the Red Sea of old,

a type of the Virgin Bride was prefigured.

There Moses divided the waters;

here <u>Ga</u>briel assisted in the <u>mir</u>acle.

There Israel crossed the sea without getting wet,

here the Virgin gave birth to Christ without seed.

After <u>Is</u>rael's passage, the sea remained im<u>pas</u>sable;

after Emmanuel's birth, the Virgin remained a Virgin.

O ever-existing God Who appeared as Man,//

O Lord, have mercy on us!

Aposticha

Tone 5 (for the Resurrection)

We <u>magnify</u> You in <u>songs</u> of praise, O incarnate Christ and <u>Sav</u>ior. By ac<u>cepting</u> the Cross and <u>death</u> for our sake, as the <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lover</u> of man, You overthrew the <u>gates</u> of hell,// and arose on the <u>third</u> day, <u>saving</u> our souls.

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

By being <u>pierced</u> in the side, O <u>Lov</u>er of man, You have poured out drops of life and sal<u>va</u>tion for all. By ac<u>cepting</u> death in the flesh, You have granted us immor<u>tal</u>ity. You have <u>freed</u> us by being <u>placed</u> in the tomb, and have resurrected us with Yourself in <u>glo</u>ry, as God.// Glory to You, O <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lov</u>er of man!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Your cruci<u>fix</u>ion and descent into hell are awesome, O <u>Lov</u>er of man. You have captured it, releasing the ancient <u>pris</u>oners. You have <u>opened Paradise</u> and <u>giv</u>en it to us. <u>Grant</u> us purification of sins, who glorify Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day! Make us <u>wor</u>thy of <u>Paradise</u>// and <u>save</u> us, O <u>Lov</u>er of man!

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

For our <u>sake</u>, You accepted <u>death</u> in the flesh, to rise from the dead on the <u>third</u> day. <u>Heal</u> us from our earthly <u>passions</u>, and restore us from our evil transgressions;// and <u>save</u> us, O <u>Lover of man!</u>

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 2 (for St. Catherine)

You acquired an immaterial life; coming before the godless tribunal, you stood arrayed in divine might, O victorious and honored <u>Catherine</u>, wearing the radiance of God as an adornment of <u>flowers!</u> You mocked the tyrants command, O greatly <u>suffering one</u>,// ending the insolent speech of the <u>or</u>ators.

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 *(for the Feast)*

<u>Da</u>vid foretold you, O all-<u>pure</u> one,

as he foresaw the sanctification of your entry into the Temple.

Thus, all the ends of the earth feast today and glorify you, O all-praised one.

For, O Mother of the Word of Life,

a virgin before giving birth and remaining incorrupt after giving birth,

Zachariah is joyful and accepts you in the <u>Tem</u>ple, O <u>La</u>dy.

The Holy of Holies rejoices and receives you, the wellspring of our life.

Therefore, we also cry out in songs to you://

"Beseech your Son and our God in our behalf, that He grant us great mercy!"

(at Great Vespers)

The Virgin appears in the <u>Temple</u> of God, in anticipation proclaiming <u>Christ</u> to all. Let us rejoice and <u>sing</u> to her: "Rejoice, O Ful<u>fill</u>ment// of the Creator's dispensation!"

Let <u>all</u> of us who love to honor the <u>martyrs</u> form a great choir in praise of the most wise <u>Catherine</u>, for she preached <u>Christ</u> and trampled the <u>serpent</u>,// despising the <u>know</u>ledge of the <u>or</u>ators.

Tone 4 Kontakion (Feast)

The most pure Temple of the <u>Sav</u>ior; the precious Chamber and <u>Virg</u>in; the sacred Treasure of the <u>glo</u>ry of God, is presented today to the <u>house</u> of the Lord. She brings with her the grace of the <u>Spir</u>it, therefore, the angels of God <u>praise</u> her:// "Truly this woman is the abode of <u>Heav</u>en!"

Tone 5 Prokeimenon (Resurrection)

You, O Lord, shall protect us / and preserve us from this generation forever. (*Ps.* 11:7)

V. Save me, O Lord, for there is no longer any that is godly! (Ps. 11:1a)

Tone 3 Prokeimenon (Song of the Theotokos)

My soul magnifies the Lord, / and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior. (Lk. 1:46-47)
