## 24th Sunday after Pentecost (12th of Luke), Ven. Patapius of Thebes

#### "Lord I Call..." Tone 7

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

<u>Let</u> my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your <u>sight</u> as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sacrifice!//</u> <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

**V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

## **Tone 7** *(for the Resurrection)*

Come, let us rejoice in the Lord, Who destroyed the dominion of death! Let us sing to Him with the bodiless hosts, for He enlightened the race of man!// O our Maker and Savior, glory to You!

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

You en<u>dured</u> the Cross and <u>bur</u>ial for our sake. By Your <u>death</u>, You destroyed <u>death</u> as God. We fall <u>down</u> before Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day,//O <u>Sav</u>ior, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

When the Apostles beheld the Resurrection of the Maker, they were amazed and sang the angelic praise.

This is the glory of the Church.

This is the richness of the Kingdom.//
O Lord, crucified for our sake, glory to You!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

### (Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

You were <u>held</u> by lawless <u>men</u>, O Christ, but to <u>me</u>, You are God, and I am <u>not</u> ashamed. You were <u>smit</u>ten on the cheek, but I do not de<u>ny</u> You. You were <u>nailed</u> to the Cross and I do not con<u>ceal</u> it, for I <u>glo</u>ry in Your Resurrection: Your <u>death</u> is my life.// O Almighty Lord and Lover of <u>man</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Ful<u>fill</u>ing the prophecy of <u>Da</u>vid,

<u>Christ</u> manifested His greatness in Zion to the dis<u>ci</u>ples.

He is <u>praised</u> and always <u>glo</u>rified,
to<u>get</u>her with the Father and the Holy <u>Spir</u>it.

At <u>first</u> as the Word, He was <u>bod</u>iless,
but <u>then</u> He took flesh and was <u>slain</u> for our sake.//
He rose in power as the Lover of man!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

You des<u>cend</u>ed into hell as You <u>willed</u>, O Christ, over<u>throwing</u> death as God, and rising on the third day as <u>Mas</u>ter! With Your<u>self</u> You raised Adam from the bonds of hell and from cor<u>rup</u>tion!// Glory to Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O only <u>Lov</u>er of man!

**V.** (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

You were <u>placed</u> in the tomb, O Lord, as <u>one</u> asleep. On the <u>third</u> day You rose in <u>power</u>, raising <u>Adam</u> with Yourself from the cor<u>rup</u>tion of death// <u>as</u> the <u>Almighty</u> One!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

## **Tone 1** (for Ven. Patapius) (O all-praised martyrs)

O <u>Fa</u>ther Pa<u>ta</u>pius, you quenched the fires of fleshly passion with <u>ab</u>stinence. Like E<u>lij</u>ah of old you lived in the <u>des</u>ert; you purified your mind with in<u>ces</u>sant <u>prayer</u> to God.// Pray now that He may grant our souls peace and great <u>mer</u>cy!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

O <u>Fa</u>ther Pa<u>ta</u>pius, you enrolled yourself in the ranks of <u>those</u> who fast, <u>cloth</u>ing yourself with dis<u>pas</u>sion.

Now you live in the <u>man</u>sions of the <u>ven</u>erable ones, where the <u>light</u> does not fade and the Tree of <u>Life</u> stands.//

Pray now that peace and great mercy may be <u>granted</u> to our souls!

**V.** (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

O <u>Fa</u>ther Pa<u>tapius</u>, you shone forth as a beacon from <u>Egypt</u>, en<u>light</u>ening the world with the brightness of your <u>mir</u>acles. You dispelled the gloom of soul-de<u>stroy</u>ing in<u>fir</u>mities, <u>driv</u>ing off the darkness of <u>de</u>mons.//
Pray now that peace and great mercy may be granted to our souls!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

## **Tone 7** (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

No tongue can speak of your wonderful childbearing, for the order of nature was overruled by God.

You were revealed to be a Mother above nature, for you remained a Virgin beyond reason and understanding. Your conception was most glorious, O Theotokos!

The manner of your giving birth was ineffable, O Virgin!

Knowing you to be the Mother of God, devoutly we pray to you://

"Beseech Him to save our souls!"

# **Aposticha**

## **Tone 7** *(for the Resurrection)*

As the <u>Sav</u>ior of the world You a<u>rose</u> from the tomb. As <u>God</u> You resurrected the race of <u>man</u> with Your flesh.// O <u>Lord</u>, <u>glory</u> to You!

**V**. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

<u>Come</u>, let us worship the One Who <u>rose</u> from the dead, and en<u>light</u>ened all creation!

By His <u>death</u>, He saved us from the <u>tor</u>ments of hell.//

By His Resurrection He has granted us eternal life and great mercy.

**V**. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

You descended into hell, capturing death, O Christ. In three days You arose again, resurrecting us who glorify Your Resurrection,// O Lord and Lover of man.

**V.** Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

When <u>You</u> were placed in the tomb as <u>one</u> asleep, the <u>sight</u> was great and <u>awe</u>some.

But when <u>You</u> rose on the third day as al<u>mighty</u> God, <u>You</u> resurrected <u>Ad</u>am with Yourself.//
Glory to Your Resurrection, only <u>Lover</u> of man!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

All the <u>earth</u>-born run to your protection, O <u>La</u>dy! <u>You</u> are our hope, O Theo<u>to</u>kos! De<u>liv</u>er us from our <u>count</u>less sins// and <u>pray</u> that our <u>souls</u> may be saved.

# **Tone 7** Troparion (*Resurrection*)

By Your <u>Cross</u> You destroyed <u>death</u>. To the thief You opened <u>Paradise</u>. For the <u>Myrrh</u>bearers You changed weeping into <u>joy</u>. And You commanded Your disciples, O <u>Christ</u> God, to pro<u>claim</u> that You are <u>risen</u>,// granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mercy</u>.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

### Tone 8 Troparion (Ven. Patapius)

The image of <u>God</u> was <u>truly</u> preserved in you, O <u>Father</u>, for you took <u>up</u> the <u>Cross</u> and <u>fol</u>lowed Christ.

By so <u>doing</u>, you <u>taught</u> us to disregard the flesh for it <u>passes</u> away; but to care in<u>stead</u> for the <u>soul</u>, for it is im<u>mor</u>tal.//
Therefore your <u>spir</u>it, <u>ven</u>erable Pa<u>ta</u>pius, rejoices with the <u>ang</u>els.

#### **Tone 8** Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion

For our sake You were <u>born</u> of <u>the Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fix</u>ion, O <u>Good</u> One, destroying <u>death</u> by death.

Revealing the <u>Resurrection</u> as God, do not despise the <u>work</u> of Your hand!

Reveal Your <u>love</u> for <u>man</u>, O Merciful One, and accept the Theotokos <u>pray</u>ing for us,//

and save the despairing <u>people</u>, O our <u>Savior!</u>

# (at the Divine Liturgy)

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### Tone 7 Kontakion (Resurrection)

The dominion of death can no longer hold men <u>captive</u>, for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its <u>powers</u>. Hell is <u>bound</u>, while the Prophets rejoice and cry: "The Savior has come to <u>those</u> in faith;// enter, you <u>faithful</u>, into the Resur<u>rec</u>tion!"

### Tone 3 Kontakion (Ven. Patapius)

Your temple is <u>found</u> to be a source of <u>heal</u>ing, and the people flock to it <u>eag</u>erly, O saint. They seek the <u>heal</u>ing of their dis<u>eases</u> and the forgiveness of their sins,// for you are a protector for all those in <u>need</u>, ven'rable Pa<u>tapius</u>.

## Tone 7 Prokeimenon (Resurrection)

The Lord shall give strength to His people. / The Lord shall bless His people with peace. (*Ps. 28:11*)

V. Offer to the Lord, O you sons of God! Offer young rams to the Lord! (Ps. 28:1a)
