Tone 2 (*With what crowns*)

With what wreaths shall we crown the venerable <u>Her</u>man, teacher of the Aleuts and apostle of <u>Or</u>thodoxy? He <u>left</u> his native land and went to the Native <u>people</u> to proclaim Christ and the <u>Or</u>thodox faith. He was neither afraid nor terrified of the Enemy's <u>dark</u>ness, but <u>aided</u> by di<u>vine grace</u>,// he enlightened a nation and led it to Christ, Who has great mercy.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

With what wreaths shall we crown the venerable <u>Her</u>man, teacher of the Aleuts and apostle of <u>Or</u>thodoxy? He re<u>ceived</u> the Valaam leavening of the Holy <u>Spir</u>it and preached the Gospel to the Aleuts in <u>word</u> and deed, disregarding, along with the flesh, all that is <u>of</u> the flesh. With <u>tears</u> and prayers, with suffering and with prolonged <u>fasting</u>, and with a most immortal love for the <u>people</u>,// he led them to Christ, Who has great <u>mercy</u>.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

With what wreaths shall we crown the venerable <u>Her</u>man, teacher of the Aleuts and apostle of <u>Or</u>thodoxy? Along with the <u>struggle</u> in the wilderness and the feat of <u>hol</u>iness, he accomplished the work of an apostle of <u>Or</u>thodoxy. Laboring greatly, he saved the Native peoples from the Evil One's de<u>lu</u>sion, re<u>ceiv</u>ing the grace of working <u>won</u>ders, quenching the fires and turning back assaults of the <u>wa</u>ters.// Having reached the end, he passed over to Christ, Who has great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. **(3)** *For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.*

Tone 4 (You have given a sign)

You have given a sign to the <u>Al</u>euts, O Lord, by the hand of the Monk <u>Her</u>man, that they might <u>pow</u>erfully entrust themselves to You, O <u>Son</u> of God; that being saved from the demonic <u>dark</u>ness, they might enter Your <u>Light</u> without <u>eve</u>ning. Like Your A<u>pos</u>tles, O Lord, the venerable Herman, dwelling by the <u>o</u>cean, began <u>catch</u>ing not fish from water, but <u>hu</u>man souls. With the help of Your grace his catch was <u>mighty</u>. Having led the people to the solid shore of <u>Or</u>tho<u>doxy</u>, he is glorified in Your <u>pres</u>ence. Therefore we glorify Your economy of <u>love</u> for mankind,// O Almighty Jesus, the <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls. **V**. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

In tender compassion, You accepted the struggle of the Monk <u>Her</u>man, O Lord, and bestowed upon him the <u>help</u> of grace, You com<u>plet</u>ed his growth to the stature of Your A<u>pos</u>tles, and You received him into the dwellings of the Kingdom of <u>Heav</u>en, granting him boldness to <u>pray</u> for the <u>peoples</u>. Therefore we glorify Your economy of <u>love</u> for mankind,// O Almighty Jesus, the <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls.
