TONE 1

26<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost (14<sup>th</sup> of Luke) Forefeast/Sunday before the Nativity of Christ

"Lord I Call..." Tone 1

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sacrifice!//</u> Hear me, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

#### **Tone 1** *(for the Resurrection)*

Ac<u>cept</u> our evening prayers, O <u>ho</u>ly Lord! Grant us re<u>mis</u>sion of sins,// for You alone have manifested the Resurrection to the world.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

Encircle Zion and surround her, O people!
Give glory in her to the One Who rose from the dead!
For He is our God,//
Who has delivered us from our transgressions!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Come, O people, let us hymn and fall <u>down</u> before Christ, <u>glo</u>rifying His Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the dead! For <u>He</u> is <u>our</u> God,//
Who has delivered the world from the Enemy's deceit!

**V.** (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

#### (Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

Be glad, O heavens!
Sound trumpets, O foun<u>da</u>tions of the earth!
Sing in <u>glad</u>ness, O <u>moun</u>tains!
Behold Emmanuel has <u>nailed</u> our <u>sins</u> to the Cross!
Granting <u>life</u>, He has <u>slain</u> death.//
He has resurrected Adam as the Lover of man.

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

## **Tone 6** (for the Forefeast) (Having placed all their hope)

The never-setting Sun presses <u>for</u>ward to rise, enlightening all things under <u>heaven</u>. Let us hasten with clean hands and pure deeds to <u>meet</u> Him; let us prepare to be borne on high with Him in <u>spirit!</u> Let us beseech Him in His com<u>passion</u>, that, as He comes in His good pleasure to His <u>own</u> strange birth, He may lead us, who have become <u>strangers</u> to the path of life in <u>Eden</u>,// into Bethlehem where He <u>comes</u> to be born!

**V.** (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

The Word of God, upborne on the shoulders of the <a href="cherubim">cherubim</a>, goes to dwell in a womb without <a href="bleemish">blemish</a>.

Though without passions, He is bound <a href="fast">fast</a> to the flesh;
He comes on earth as a man, born of the tribe of <a href="Judah">Judah</a>.

A cave becomes the palace of the <a href="King">King</a> of all;
the fiery throne is replaced by a <a href="manger">manger</a>,
where the Virgin Mary <a href="manger">lays</a> Him as a babe,
for He comes to restore the first-created man,//
as He is well-<a href="manger">pleased</a> so to do.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

O Word of God without beginning, the Virgin lays You in a manger of dumb beasts. You choose to begin Your life in the flesh in a manner beyond understanding. You ahve come to loose me from the fetters of evil with which the envious serpent bound me. O Lover of man, You are wrapped in swaddling clothes, tearing to pieces the bonds of my countless sins. Therefore I joyfully praise and worship Your holy birth,//for You came to set me free.

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

**Tone 6** (for the Holy Fathers) (Having placed all their hope)

The memory of the Ancestors is revealed to the <u>ends</u> of the world, truly <u>fill</u>ing it with light and making known the <u>dawn</u>ing of grace. For Christ shone forth from afar, <u>bright</u>er than the sun, the leading rank of stars <u>shin</u>ing with Him; and the divine-human birth was revealed to take place in <u>Beth</u>lehem. Therefore with faith let us all <u>gath</u>er at this birth,// rejoicing in chorus and singing the pre-<u>fest</u>al praise!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Adorned with the glory of divine com<u>munion</u>,
Adam rejoices today,
as he is the foundation and support of the wise <u>An</u>cestors.
With him Abel leaps with joy, and <u>E</u>noch makes glad;
Seth dances, and <u>No</u>ah with him;
the all-praiseworthy Patriarch <u>A</u>braham sings;
Melchizedek beholds from afar the birth that is without a <u>fa</u>ther.
Therefore, as we celebrate the divine memory of the <u>Forefathers</u> of Christ,//we pray for the salvation of our souls.

**V.** (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

The three Youths, <u>wise</u> in God, who shone with joy in the <u>fur</u>nace, proclaimed the birth of <u>Christ</u> on earth; For just as the Lord sent down a <u>pre</u>cious dew, He preserved from the flame <u>her</u> who gave birth, keeping her undefiled and enriching her with di<u>vine</u> gifts. Therefore Daniel, pleasing to God, rejoiced and was glad, for having foreseen the Stone from the unquarried <u>mountain</u>,//he now prays with boldness in be<u>half</u> of our souls.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

#### **Tone 6** *(for the Holy Fathers)*

Daniel, the man of desires, be<u>held</u> You, O Lord, the Stone cut without human hands from the <u>Moun</u>tain. Thus, he foretold that You would take <u>flesh</u> without seed, O Word of God, born of the <u>Virgin</u>,// the changeless God and <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

# **Tone 6** (for the Forefeast, by Byzantius)

O cave, make ready, for the <u>Ewe</u> Lamb comes, bearing <u>Christ</u> in her womb!

O manger, receive Him Who by a word has released the dwellers of earth from <u>law</u>lessness!

You shepherds, abiding in the fields, bear witness to the fearful wonder, And you magi from Persia, offer to the King gold, myrrh, and frankincense, for the Lord has appeared from a Virgin Mother!

And she, bending over Him as a handmaiden, worshipped Him as He lay in her arms, saying to Him:

"How were You sown as seed in me?

How have You grown within me,//
O my Deliverer and my God?"
