(Following "God is with us," we sing the following)

Tone 8

The <u>day</u> is over; I <u>thank</u> You, O Lord! Grant me to pass this evening and this <u>night</u> without sin,//and save me, O Savior!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

The <u>day</u> is over; I glorify You, O <u>Mas</u>ter! Grant me to pass this evening and this night without <u>giv</u>ing offense,//and save me, O <u>Sav</u>ior!

The <u>day</u> is over; I sing to You, O <u>Ho</u>ly One! Grant me to pass this evening and this night free from temp<u>ta</u>tion,//and save me, O <u>Sav</u>ior!

Tone 6

The bodiless Cherubim glorify You with never-<u>ending</u> songs. The six-winged Seraphim exalt You with ceaseless <u>voices</u>. All the hosts of Angels honor You with the <u>thrice</u>-holy hymn. For You, O Father, are from all eternity, with Your co-<u>eternal Son</u>, and with the Spirit of life, Who is <u>equal</u> to You;// You have revealed the unity of the Trinity.

O most-holy Virgin and Mother of God, and you eye-witnesses and servants of the Word, all you choirs of prophets and martyrs, who enjoy eternal life, fervently pray for us all, who are in fearful distress, that we may be delivered from the deceit of the Evil One, so that we may sing the song of the Angels: Holy, holy, holy, Thrice-holy Lord,// have mercy on us and save us!

Tone 1 *(by John the Monk)*

Make merry, O heaven and earth, as the Prophets foretold! Celebrate in the spirit, O Angels and men!

God is born from a woman and appears in the flesh to those who sit in darkness and shadow.

A cave and a manger welcome Him.

Shepherds announce the wonder.

Wise Men from the East offer gifts in Bethlehem.

Let us from our unworthy lips offer praise like the Angels: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace!"

The Expectation of the Nations has come.//

He has come and saved us from bondage to the Enemy.

Today heaven and earth are united, for <u>Christ</u> is born.
