SUNDAY, JANUARY 5 28th Sunday after Pentecost: Sunday Before/eve of the Theophany Hieromartyr Theopemptus, Bishop of Nicomedia, and Martyr Theonas

"Lord I Call..." Tone 3

Lord, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me. Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord. Lord, I call upon Thee, <u>hear</u> me. Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon Thee.// Hear me, O Lord.

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Thy sight as <u>in</u>cense, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice.// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord.

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Thy Name.

Tone 3(for the Resurrection)

By Thy Cross, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, death's dominion has been <u>shat</u>tered; the devil's de<u>lu</u>sion destroyed. The race of man, being <u>saved</u> by faith,// always <u>offers Thee</u> a song.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for Thou wilt deal bountifully with me.

All has been enlightened by Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord. Paradise has been <u>opened again</u>. All creation, <u>prais</u>ing Thee,// always <u>offers Thee</u> a song.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to Thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

I glorify the power of the <u>Fa</u>ther and the Son. I praise the authority of the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit: the undivided, uncreated <u>Godhead</u>,// the consubstantial Trinity which <u>reigns</u> for<u>ev</u>er.

V. (7) Let Thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

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(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

We bow down in worship before Thy precious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, and we glorify and praise Thy Resur<u>rection</u>,// for by Thy <u>wounds</u> we have <u>all</u> been healed.

V. (6) If Thou, O Lord, shouldst mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with Thee.

Tone 6 (for the Forefeast) (On the third day)

O earth and you that are <u>born</u> on earth, leap for joy and a<u>dorn</u> yourselves; the Torrent of Delight is baptized in the <u>river</u>, drying up the flood of <u>evil</u>,// and gushing forth divine re<u>mis</u>sion.

V. (5) For Thy Name's sake I wait for Thee, O Lord. My soul has waited for Thy word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Jesus, as the Be<u>stow</u>er of Light, has no need to be baptized, yet He comes in the flesh to the streams of <u>Jor</u>dan, wishing to enlighten those in <u>dark</u>ness;// in faith let us eagerly go to <u>meet</u> Him.

V. (4) *From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!*

Bearing the appearance of a servant,

Christ comes to be baptized in the streams of the Jordan by a <u>ser</u>vant, granting deliverance from the servitude of the <u>an</u>cient sin,// and sanctifying and en<u>light</u>ening us.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and *He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.*

Let us praise the wise Theonas and Theopemptus;

for, obedient to the precepts of Christ, they utterly demolished all lawless <u>wor</u>ship,

and <u>pi</u>ously offered the worship that is august and <u>ho</u>ly, courageously confessing one Lord and God in the presence of the <u>ty</u>rants;// and they have been <u>crowned</u> from on high.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

Having abandoned the <u>base</u> way of life, the comfort of luxury and fading glory as being <u>transient</u>, you have <u>cleaved</u> to Christ, O all-<u>praise</u>worthy saints. How pleasantly you shone with His fair <u>beau</u>ty! And you were offered as <u>fragrant ros</u>es.// Divinely strengthened, you were crowned with the crown of the incorruptible Kingdom

<u>King</u>dom.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Having hated the world, you appeared as a<u>bove</u> the world, and were joined to the Church of the <u>First</u>-born. With the <u>Ang</u>els you sing the un<u>fad</u>ing song, as you stand face to <u>face</u> with God; and having destroyed the lawless de<u>ceit</u> of <u>i</u>dols,// as martyrs, you overthrew the madness of the <u>ty</u>rants.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(for the Forefeast)*

Prepare, O River Jordan! Behold, Christ is coming to be baptized by John in thee! Rejoice, O barren <u>wil</u>derness! Dance in gladness, O hills and <u>moun</u>tains! Eternal Life is coming to reclaim <u>Ad</u>am. O Forerunner, call out with the voice of <u>one</u> who cries:// "Prepare the ways of the Lord! Make <u>straight</u> His paths!"

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 3 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

How can we not <u>won</u>der at thy mystical childbearing, O exalted <u>Moth</u>er? For without receiving the <u>touch</u> of man, thou gavest birth to a Son in the flesh, O immaculate <u>Virgin</u>. The Son born of the Father before e<u>ter</u>nity was born of thee at the fullness of time, O honored <u>La</u>dy. He underwent no mingling, no change, no di<u>vi</u>sion, but preserved the fullness of each <u>na</u>ture. Entreat Him, O Lady and Virgin and <u>Mo</u>ther, to save the souls of those who, in the Orthodox manner, con<u>fess</u> thee// to be the <u>Theoto</u>kos.

Aposticha

Tone 3 *(for the Resurrection)*

The sun was darkened by Thy <u>Pas</u>sion, O Christ, but all creation was enlightened by the light of Thy Resur<u>rec</u>tion.// Accept our evening <u>song</u>, O <u>Lov</u>er of man!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Thy life-bearing Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord, enlightened the whole universe, recalling Thy cre<u>a</u>tion. Delivered from Adam's <u>curse</u>, we sing:// O Almighty <u>Lord</u>, <u>glory</u> to Thee!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Thou art the <u>change</u>less God, Who, suffering in the <u>flesh</u>, wast changed. Creation could not endure seeing <u>Thee</u> on the Cross. It was filled with fear while praising Thy <u>pa</u>tience. By descending to hell and rising on the <u>third</u> day,// Thou hast granted to the world <u>life</u> and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Holiness befits Thy house, O Lord, forevermore!

Thou didst endure <u>death</u>, O Christ, to deliver the race of <u>men</u> from death. Thou didst rise from the dead on the <u>third</u> day, raising with Thyself those who <u>knew</u> Thee as God// and enlightening the <u>world</u>. <u>Glory</u> to Thee! Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 6(for the Forefeast)

Let the wilderness of Jordan rejoice exceedingly, and burst into flower, like a <u>lily;</u> for the voice of one crying out has been <u>heard</u> there: "Prepare the <u>way</u> of the Lord." For He Who caused the mountains to rise <u>up</u> in their place, and fixed the <u>valleys</u> with a yoke, Who as God ful<u>fills</u> all things, is baptized as a <u>servant;</u> He becomes poor, Who bestows a<u>bun</u>dant gifts. Eve heard the words, "In sorrow wilt thou bear <u>chil</u>dren," but now the <u>Virgin</u> has heard: "Rejoice, O maiden <u>full</u> of grace,// the Lord, Who bestows great mercy, is <u>with</u> thee!"

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 3 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

Let the heavens rejoice! Let the <u>earth</u> be glad! For the Lord has shown <u>strength</u> with His arm. He has trampled down <u>death</u> by death. He has become the <u>first</u> born of the dead. He has delivered us from the <u>depths</u> of hell, and has <u>grant</u>ed to the world// <u>great mercy</u>.

> Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 4 Troparion of the Forefeast

The River Jordan was turned back by the mantle of Elisha, after Elijah had been taken up to <u>heav</u>en. The waters were <u>part</u>ed in two, and the stream became a <u>dry</u> path. This was truly a type of <u>bap</u>tism, by which we pass over the <u>stream</u> of life.// Christ has shone forth in the Jordan to sanctify the <u>waters</u>. (at the Divine Liturgy)

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Tone 3Kontakion (Resurrection)

On this day Thou didst rise from the tomb, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One, leading us from the <u>gates</u> of death. On this day Adam exults as Eve rejoices; with the Prophets and <u>Pa</u>triarchs// they unceasingly praise the divine <u>majesty</u> of Thy <u>power</u>.

Tone 21st Kontakion(Forefeast)

O <u>Christ</u>, in Thy compassion and infinite <u>mer</u>cy, Thou art coming as a man to be baptized in the <u>Jor</u>dan, in <u>ord</u>er to take away the many trans<u>gres</u>sions of us all, clothing me in the garment of ancient <u>glory</u>// of which I was <u>cru</u>elly <u>stripped</u> bare.

Tone 42nd Kontakion(Forefeast)

Today the Lord enters the Jordan and cries <u>out</u> to John: "Do not be afraid to <u>bap</u>tize Me.// For I have come to save Adam, the <u>first</u>-formed man." Tone 6Prokeimenon(Sunday Before)

O Lord, save Thy people, / and bless Thine inheritance! (Ps. 27:9a)

V. To Thee, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent to me! (Ps. 27:1a)
