JANUARY 6 The Holy Theophany of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ Great Blessing of Waters

(After the prayer before the ambo at the end of Liturgy, the clergy go in procession, with candles and incense, to the place where the Blessing of Water is to take place. The priest holds the precious cross in his hand. The choir sings the following stichera: by Sophronios, Patriarch of Jerusalem:)

Stichera at the Great Blessing of Water

Tone 8 (by Sophronios, Patriarch of Jerusalem)

The <u>voice</u> of the Lord is upon the waters <u>cry</u>ing: "<u>Come</u>, one and all, receive the <u>Spir</u>it of <u>wis</u>dom, the Spirit of under<u>stand</u>ing, the Spirit of the <u>fear</u> of God,// from Christ Who now has <u>shone</u> forth!" (*thrice*)

To<u>day</u> the nature of the waters is <u>sanc</u>tified: The Jordan is <u>part</u>ed in two. It holds back the <u>flow</u> of its <u>wa</u>ters,// as it beholds the washing of the <u>Mas</u>ter. (*twice*)

You have <u>come</u> to the river as a man, O <u>Christ</u> the King, hastening to be baptized like a servant by the <u>Fore</u>runner// on account of our sins, O good God Who <u>love</u> mankind. (*twice*)

> Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8

To the <u>voice</u> of one crying in the <u>wil</u>derness, "Prepare the <u>way</u> of the Lord," You came, O Lord, taking the <u>form</u> of <u>ser</u>vant. You asked to be baptized though You have no <u>know</u>ledge of sin. The waters <u>saw</u> You and were afraid. The Forerunner <u>trem</u>bled and <u>cried</u> aloud: "How will the Lamp il<u>lu</u>mine the Light? How will a servant lay his hand on the <u>Mas</u>ter? You take away the sin of the <u>world</u>, O <u>Sav</u>ior.// Sanctify both me and the <u>wa</u>ters!"

The Lord is my light and my Savior; / whom shall I fear? (Ps. 26:1a)

Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

V. The voice of the Lord is upon the waters; the God of glory thunders; the Lord is upon many waters. (*Ps.* 28:3)

Gospel (2) Mark 1:9-11

Tone 1 Troparion

When You, O Lord, were baptized in the Jordan, the worship of the Trinity was made manifest. For the voice of the Father bore witness to You, and called You His beloved Son; and the Spirit in the form of a dove confirmed the truthfulness of His word. O Christ our God, You have revealed Yourself// and have enlightened the world, glory to You. (At the conclusion of the Blessing of the Water, this sticheron is sung.)

Tone 6

Let us the faithful praise the greatness of God's <u>plan</u> for us. For He Who alone is <u>pure</u> and undefiled becomes a man because of our trans<u>gres</u>sions. He is cleansed with our cleansing in the <u>Jor</u>dan, sanctifying both us and the <u>wa</u>ters, and crushing the heads of the dragons in the <u>wa</u>ter. Therefore, let us draw water in <u>glad</u>ness, for upon those who <u>draw</u> in faith the grace of the Spirit is invisibly bestowed by <u>Christ</u> God,// the Savior of our souls.

Tone 1 Troparion

When You, O Lord, were baptized in the Jordan, the worship of the Trinity was made <u>manifest</u>. For the <u>voice</u> of the Father bore <u>witness</u> to You, and called You His be<u>lov</u>ed Son; and the <u>Spir</u>it in the form of a <u>dove</u> confirmed the <u>truth</u>fulness of His word. O <u>Christ</u> our God, You have re<u>vealed</u> Yourself// and have enlightened the world, <u>glory</u> to You.

Tone 4 Kontakion

Today You have shone forth to the <u>world</u>, O Lord, and the light of Your countenance has been <u>marked</u> on us. Knowing You, we sing Your <u>prais</u>es: "You have come and re<u>vealed</u> Yourself,// O unap<u>proach</u>able Light."
