TONE 8

Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee, Leavetaking of the Meeting of the Lord [Beginning of the Lenten Triodion]

"Lord I Call..." Tone 8

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of <u>my</u> hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

Tone 8 *(for the Resurrection)*

We <u>offer</u> to <u>You</u>, O Christ, our evening song and reasonable <u>ser</u>vice, for You <u>willed</u> to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Lord, Lord, do not cast us a<u>way</u> from Your face! For You willed to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Rejoice, O holy Zion:

Mother of the churches, the a<u>bode</u> of God, for you were the first to re<u>ceive</u> re<u>mis</u>sion of sins// by the Resurrection.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 1* *Idiomela* (from the Lenten Triodion)

Brothers, let us not pray like the Pharisee! He who exalts himself will be humbled. Let us prepare to abase ourselves by fasting; let us cry aloud with the voice of the Publican://"O God, forgive us sinners!"

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

The <u>Phar</u>isee went up to the temple with a proud and <u>emp</u>ty heart; the Publican bowed himself in re<u>pentance</u>.

They <u>both</u> stood before You, O <u>Mas</u>ter: the one, through <u>boasting</u>, <u>lost</u> his reward, but the <u>oth</u>er, with tears and sighs, won Your <u>blessing</u>: Strengthen me, O Christ our God, as I weep in Your <u>presence</u>,// since You are the Lover of man!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 1 *Idiomela (for the Feast, by Patriarch Germanus)*

Simeon, tell us, Whom you bear in your arms, that you rejoice so greatly in the Temple? To Whom do you shout and cry aloud: "Now I am set free, for I have seen my Savior?" This is He Who was born of a Virgin; this is God the Word, Who came forth from God, Who for our sakes has taken flesh and has saved man.// Let us worship Him!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

<u>Sim</u>eon, receive Him Whom Moses once beheld in <u>darkness</u>, granting the Law on <u>Si</u>nai, now that <u>He</u> has become a Babe <u>subject</u> to the Law! This is <u>He</u> Who <u>spoke</u> through the Law. This is <u>He</u>, of Whom the <u>Proph</u>ets spoke, Who for our sakes has taken flesh and has <u>saved</u> man.// Let us <u>wor</u>ship Him!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

<u>Come</u>, let us also go to meet Christ with di<u>vine</u> songs! Let us receive Him Whose salvation <u>Simeon saw!</u> This is <u>He</u> Whom <u>Dav</u>id announced; this is He Who <u>spoke</u> in the <u>Proph</u>ets, <u>Who</u>, for our sakes, has taken flesh and Who <u>speaks</u> through the Law.// Let us worship Him!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Tone 6 *(for the Feast, by John the Monk)*

Let the gate of heaven be opened today, for the unoriginate Word of the Father has made a beginning in time without forsaking His divinity. As a Babe forty days old, of His own will He is brought by the Virgin, His Mother, as an offering in the Temple of the Law. The Elder receives Him in his arms, crying as a servant to his Master: "Let me depart for my eyes have seen Your salvation!"// Glory to You, O Lord, for You have come into the world to save mankind.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 8 *(from the Lenten Triodion)*

I <u>know</u> the value of tears, O al<u>mighty</u> Lord: they delivered Hezekiah from the <u>gates</u> of death, and rescued the <u>har</u>lot from re<u>peated</u> sins.

Tears justified the Publican instead of the <u>Phar</u>isee.

I <u>pray</u> You, O Lord://

"Number me with the former, and have <u>mer</u>cy on me!"

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The <u>King</u> of heaven, because of His <u>love</u> for man, appeared on earth and <u>dwelt</u> with men. He took <u>flesh</u> from the pure <u>Virgin</u> and after assuming it, He came <u>forth</u> from her. The Son is one: in two natures, yet one <u>Person</u>. Proclaiming Him as perfect <u>God</u> and <u>perfect Man</u>, we confess <u>Christ</u> our God!//
Entreat Him, O unwedded Mother, to have mercy on our souls.

Aposticha

Tone 8 *(for the Resurrection)*

Descending from heaven to ascend the Cross, the eternal Life has come for death to raise those who are fallen; to enlighten those in darkness.//
O Jesus, our Savior and illuminator, glory to You!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

We <u>glor</u>ify Christ, who <u>rose</u> from the dead. He accepted the human <u>body</u> and soul, and freed <u>both</u> from <u>suf</u>fering. His most pure soul descended to <u>hell</u>, which He spoiled. His holy body did not see cor<u>rup</u>tion in the tomb.// He is the Redeemer of our souls.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

In <u>psalms</u> and songs we glorify Your Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, O Christ. By it, You have freed us from the <u>tor</u>tures of hell// and as God have granted eternal life and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

O<u>Mas</u>ter of all, incomprehensible Creator of <u>heaven</u> and earth, by Your suffering on the Cross You have gained <u>pas</u>sionlessness for me. Accepting burial and a<u>rising</u> in glory, You resurrected Adam with Yourself by Your al<u>mighty</u> hand. Glory to Your rising on the <u>third</u> day! By it You have granted us eternal <u>life</u> and <u>cleansing</u> of sins// as the only compassionate One.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 5 *(from the Lenten Triodion)*

The <u>weight</u> of my transgressions <u>bur</u>dens mine eyes: I cannot lift my gaze to the heights of <u>heav</u>en, O Lord. Ac<u>cept</u> me in repentance, as You accepted the <u>Pub</u>lican;//have mercy on <u>me</u>, O <u>Sav</u>ior!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 8 *(for the Feast, by Andrew of Crete)*

He Who is borne on high by the Cherubim and praised in hymns by the <u>Ser</u>aphim is brought today according to the Law into the <u>holy Temple</u> and rests in the arms of the Elder as on a throne. From Joseph He receives gifts fitting for God: a pair of doves, a symbol of the spotless Church and of the newly chosen people of the Gentiles, and two young pigeons, for He is the originator of the two <u>Cov</u>enants, both <u>Old</u> and New. Simeon, now granted the fulfillment of the prophesies concerning himself, blesses the Virgin and Theotokos Mary. He foretells in figures the Passion of her Son. From Him he begs release, <u>cry</u>ing aloud: "Now, Master, let me depart as You have promised me, for I have seen the pre-eternal Light// and the Lord and Savior of the people who bear the Name of Christ!"

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 8 Troparion (Resurrection)

You descended <u>from</u> on <u>high</u>, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One! You accepted the <u>three</u> day <u>bur</u>ial to free us from our <u>suf</u>ferings!// O Lord, our <u>Life</u> and Resur<u>rec</u>tion, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 1 Troparion (Feast)

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, <u>Full</u> of Grace! From you shone the Sun of Righteousness, <u>^Christ</u> our God, enlightening those who sat in <u>dark</u>ness. Rejoice and be glad, O righteous <u>Elder</u>, you accepted in your arms the <u>^Redeemer</u> of our souls,// Who grants us the Resurrection!

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Tone 8 Troparion (Resurrection)

You descended <u>from</u> on <u>high</u>, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One! You accepted the <u>three</u> day <u>bur</u>ial to free us from our <u>suf</u>ferings!// O Lord, our <u>Life</u> and Resur<u>rec</u>tion, <u>glory</u> to You!

Tone 1 Troparion (Feast, see above)

Tone 4 Kontakion (from the Lenten Triodion)

Let us flee from the pride of the <u>Pharisee!</u>
Let us learn humility from the <u>Publican's tears!</u>
Let us cry to our <u>Savior</u>:
"Have <u>mer</u>cy on us,//
O only <u>mer</u>ciful One!"

Tone 1 Kontakion

By Your Nativity You sanctified the <u>Virgin's</u> womb and blessed Simeon's hands, ^O <u>Christ</u> God.

Now You have come and saved <u>us</u> through love.

Grant <u>peace</u> to all Orthodox <u>Christians</u>,//
O only <u>Lover</u> of Man!

Tone 8 Prokeimenon (*Resurrection*)

Pray and make your vows / before the Lord, our God! (Ps. 75:10a)

V. In Judah God is known; His Name is great in Israel. (Ps. 75:1)

Tone 3 Prokeimenon (Song of the Theotokos)

My soul magnifies the Lord, / and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior. (Lk. 1:46-47)

Epistle

(296) 2 Timothy 3:10-15 (316) Hebrews 7:7-17 (*Feast*)

Tone 8

Alleluia, Alleluia!

- **V.** Come, let us rejoice in the Lord! Let us make a joyful noise to God our Savior! (Ps. 94:1)

In the shadow and letter of the Law, let us the faithful discern a figure: every male [child] that opens the womb is holy to God.

Therefore we magnify the firstborn Word of the Father Who has no beginning,// the Son firstborn of a Mother who had not known man.
