Cheesefare/Forgiveness Sunday) - The Expulsion of Adam from Paradise

"Lord I Call..." Tone 3

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord. Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You.// Hear me, O Lord.

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice.// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord.

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 3 *(for the Resurrection)*

By Your Cross, O Christ our <u>Savior</u>, death's dominion has been <u>shat</u>tered; the devil's de<u>lu</u>sion destroyed.
The race of man, being <u>saved</u> by faith,//always <u>offers You</u> a song.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.

All has been enlightened by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord. Paradise has been <u>opened</u> again. All creation, <u>praising You</u>,// always <u>offers You</u> a song.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

I glorify the power of the <u>Fa</u>ther and the Son. I praise the authority of the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit: the undivided, uncreated <u>God</u>head,// the consubstantial Trinity which <u>reigns</u> for<u>ev</u>er.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

We bow down in worship before Your precious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, and we glorify and praise Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion,// for by Your <u>wounds</u> we have <u>all</u> been healed.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

We praise the Savior incarnate of the <u>Virgin</u>, for He was crucified for our sake and resurrected on the <u>third</u> day,//granting <u>us</u> great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Christ descended to hell proclaiming the glad <u>ti</u>dings: "Behold! Now I have <u>tri</u>umphed!
I am the Resurrection, I will <u>lead</u> you out,// for I have <u>shat</u>tered the <u>gates</u> of death!"

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 6* (from the Lenten Triodion) (Having placed all their hope)

The Lord took a handful of <u>dust</u> from the earth. He breathed into it and created me, a <u>liv</u>ing man. He made me lord and master of <u>all</u> things on earth; truly I enjoyed the life of the <u>ang</u>els. But Satan the deceiver tempted me in the guise of a <u>ser</u>pent; I ate the forbidden fruit and forfeited the <u>glory</u> of God. Now I have been delivered to the <u>earth</u> through death.// O my compassionate Lord, call me back to <u>Eden!</u>

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

When the Enemy <u>tempted</u> me, I disobeyed Your com<u>mand</u>, O Lord. I exchanged the glory of my mortal body for shame and <u>na</u>kedness. Now I must wear garments of skins and <u>fig</u>-leaves; I am condemned to eat the bread of bitter hardship by the <u>sweat</u> of my brow. The earth is cursed and brings forth thorns and <u>husks</u> for me. O Lord, You took on flesh from the Virgin in the <u>full</u>ness of time;//call me back and restore me to <u>E</u>den!

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

O Paradise, garden of delight and <u>beauty</u>, dwelling-place made <u>perfect</u> by God, unending gladness and e<u>ternal</u> joy, the hope of the prophets and the <u>home</u> of the saints, by the music of your rustling leaves beseech the Creator of all to open the gates which my <u>sins</u> have closed, that I may partake of the Tree of <u>Life</u> and Grace// which was given to me in the beginning!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Adam was exiled from Paradise through diso<u>be</u>dience; he was driven from eternal bliss, deceived by the <u>words</u> of Eve; he sat naked and weeping before the gates of <u>Paradise</u>. Let us hasten to enter the season of <u>fasting</u>; let us carefully obey the <u>Gos</u>pel commands, that we may be made acceptable to <u>Christ</u> our God,// and regain our home in <u>E</u>den!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(from the Lenten Triodion)*

Adam sat before the gates of <u>Ed</u>en, bewailing his nakedness and <u>cry</u>ing out: "Woe to me! I have listened to <u>wicked</u> deceit; I have lost my glory, and now am <u>driv</u>en away! Woe to me! My open-mindedness hath left me <u>naked</u> and confused! No longer will I enjoy your delights, O <u>Paradise</u>; no longer can I see my Lord, my God and Creator. He formed me from dust, and now to the <u>dust</u> I return! I beg You, O com<u>passionate Lord://</u> Have mercy on me who have fallen!"

Tone 3 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

How can we not wonder at your mystical childbearing, O exalted Mother? For without receiving the touch of man, you gave birth to a Son in the flesh, O immaculate Virgin. The Son born of the Father before eternity was born of you at the fullness of time, O honored Lady. He underwent no mingling, no change, no division, but preserved the fullness of each nature. Entreat Him, O Lady and Virgin and Mother, to save the souls of those who, in the Orthodox manner, confess you// to be the Theotokos.

Aposticha

Tone 3 *(for the Resurrection)*

The sun was darkened by Your <u>Passion</u>, O Christ, but all creation was enlightened by the light of Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.// Accept our evening <u>song</u>, O <u>Lover of man!</u>

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Your life-bearing Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord, enlightened the whole universe, recalling Your cre<u>a</u>tion. Delivered from Adam's <u>curse</u>, we sing:// O Almighty <u>Lord</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

You are the <u>change</u>less God, Who, suffering in the <u>flesh</u>, were changed. Creation could not endure seeing <u>You</u> on the Cross. It was filled with fear while praising Your <u>patience</u>. By descending to hell and rising on the <u>third</u> day,// You have granted to the world <u>life</u> and great <u>mercy</u>.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

You endured <u>death</u>, O Christ, to deliver the race of <u>men</u> from death.
You rose from the dead on the <u>third</u> day, raising with Yourself those who <u>knew</u> You as God// and enlightening the <u>world</u>. <u>Glo</u>ry to You!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 *(from the Lenten Triodion)*

Adam ate the forbidden fruit and was driven from <u>Par</u>adise. He sat outside, weeping <u>bit</u>terly:

"Woe to me! What will become of me, a <u>worth</u>less man? I disobeyed one command of my Master and lost <u>eve</u>ry good thing! O holy Paradise, planted for me by God, and closed by the <u>weak</u>ness of Eve, grant that I may once again gaze on the flowers of your <u>gar</u>dens!" The Savior said to him:

"I do not wish the death of My creation!

I desire that all should be saved and come to the <u>know</u>ledge of the truth,// for him who comes to Me I shall <u>nev</u>er cast out!"

Tone 6 (Theotokion)

My Maker and Redeemer, <u>Christ</u> the Lord, was born of you, O most pure <u>Virgin</u>. By accepting my nature, He freed Adam from his <u>an</u>cient curse. Unceasingly we magnify you as the <u>Moth</u>er of God! Rejoice, O ce<u>les</u>tial Joy! Rejoice, O <u>La</u>dy://
the Protection, Intercession and Sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls!
