The 42 Martyrs of Ammoria in Phrygia, Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts

"Lord I Call..." Tone 8

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of <u>my</u> hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

- V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
- V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.
- V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Tone 8 *Idiomelon* (from the Lenten Triodion)

While <u>fasting</u> in body, O <u>brethren</u>, let us also fast in <u>spirit!</u>
Let us loose the <u>bonds</u> of iniquity!
Let us undo the chains of injustice!
Let us break the yoke of oppression!
Let us give <u>food</u> to the <u>hungry!</u>
Let us shelter the poor and <u>home</u>less,//
so that we may receive great mercy from <u>Christ</u> our God!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Tone 8 *(to the Martyrs)*

Whatever is excellent and worthy of praise is rightly ascribed to the saints, for they bowed their necks beneath the sword, for Your sake, Who bowed the heavens and came down. They shed their blood for You, Who emptied Yourself, taking the form of a servant.

They humbled themselves even unto death, following the example of Your lowliness.

By their prayers have mercy on us, O God,//according to Your abundant mercy!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 2 (to the Apostles, by Joseph) (When You appeared)

Jesus, the true <u>spir</u>itual Sun, sent you out as lightning into <u>all</u> the world,
O A<u>pos</u>tles and eye<u>wit</u>nesses of God.
He dispersed the darkness of <u>er</u>ror,
enlightening those held fast in the gloom of <u>ig</u>norance.//
Entreat Him to send down on us as well His illumination and great <u>mer</u>cy!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Glorified by <u>fasting</u>,
Elijah rode in the divine chariot of <u>vir</u>tues
and was carried <u>up</u> to the height of <u>heaven</u>.
Eagerly follow his example, O my <u>hum</u>ble soul!
Fast from every evil and <u>jeal</u>ousy,
from <u>strife</u> and fleeting <u>pleas</u>ures!
Then you will escape the everlasting torment of Ge<u>hen</u>na,//
crying out to Christ: "Glory to <u>You</u>, O Lord!"

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 5 (to the Apostles, by Theodore) (O venerable father)

O Apostles of God, fervent intercessors for the world, defenders of the Orthodox, you have power to approach Christ our God with boldness. Intercede for us, we pray you, that we may keep the holy fast in peace and receive the grace of the consubstantial Trinity!//
O great and glorious preachers, worthy of all honor, pray for our souls!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 4 (for the 42 Martyrs) (Called from on high)

O noble and victorious <u>mar</u>tyrs, you were revealed in the <u>fi</u>nal times as unwaning <u>stars</u> in the Church's honored <u>fir</u>mament. You illumined all beneath the sun, O all-<u>praised</u> ones, with the splendor of your sufferings, destroying the darkness of de<u>cep</u>tion. Therefore we celebrate your radiant and sacred <u>suf</u>fering in faith,// enriched by your inter<u>ces</u>sion.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

All-glorious two-and-forty <u>mar</u>tyrs of Christ, you were bound after a <u>sum</u>mary arrest and shut <u>up</u> in prison for a <u>lengthy</u> time. You were divine pre<u>servers</u> of the faith, who refused to submit to the commands of that infamous <u>beast</u> of <u>e</u>vil fame, Therefore he was enraged and <u>slew</u> you with the sword. Now you have joyfully inherited <u>high</u>er things,// joining yourselves to the heavenly <u>King</u>dom.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Let us shout the praise of <u>Con</u>stantine,
Basoes and Callistus, Theodore and The<u>ophilus</u>,
and the <u>rest</u> of the divine company of <u>ath</u>letes,
for they sacrificed them<u>selves</u> with joy,
electing to <u>die</u> for the <u>Life</u> of All.
Now they rest in the city of the <u>liv</u>ing God,
entreating that, on the day of <u>judgment</u>,//
we may find remission of sins and complete deliverance.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 4 (Theotokion)

O all-undefiled Theotokos,

save from all hostile slander those who piously venerate your <u>birthgiving</u>, as <u>you</u> are the protectress of the <u>hu</u>man race.

For we all have acquired you now as our help, our refuge and our confir<u>ma</u>tion, and our intercessor with Christ, our Master and God.

Entreat Him to grant peace to the world,//

and deliverance from sins, to those who hasten to your protection.

Tone 5 Prokeimenon

You, O Lord, shall protect us / and preserve us from this generation forever. (*Ps. 11:7*)

V. Save me, O Lord, for there is no longer any that is godly! (Ps. 12:1a)

Tone 6 Prokeimenon

Consider and answer me, / O Lord my God! (Ps. 12:3a)

V. How long, O Lord, will You forget me forever? How long will You hide Your face from me? (Ps. 12:1)
