"Lord I Call..." Tone 4

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> up<u>on</u> You!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 4(for the Resurrection)

We glorify Your Resurrection on the third day, O <u>Christ</u> God, by always honoring Your <u>life</u>-creating Cross; by <u>it</u>, You have renewed the corrupted <u>na</u>ture of man, O al<u>mighty</u> One. By it, You have renewed our <u>en</u>trance to <u>hea</u>ven,// for You are good and the <u>Lov</u>er of man.

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

You loosed the Tree's verdict of disobedience, O <u>Sav</u>ior, by being voluntarily nailed to the <u>tree</u> of the Cross. By de<u>scend</u>ing to hell, O al<u>mighty</u> God, You broke the <u>bonds</u> of death. Therefore, we adore Your Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, <u>sing</u>ing in joy:// "Glory to You, O all <u>powerful</u> Lord!"

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

You smashed the gates of <u>hell</u>, O Lord, and by Your death You demolished the <u>king</u>dom of death. You de<u>liv</u>ered the race of men from cor<u>rup</u>tion,// granting the world life, incorruption and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

O Lord, Whom nothing can con<u>tain</u> or grasp, from all eternity You shone forth from the <u>Fa</u>ther before the <u>morning star</u>. The Prophets, inspired by the Holy <u>Spir</u>it, foretold that You would take flesh and assume the <u>form</u> of a child, from her who is ever-v<u>irg</u>in. You <u>lived</u> among men; You were seen by material cre<u>a</u>tion. Through the prayers of the Prophets, O com<u>pas</u>sionate One, make us worthy to re<u>ceive</u> Your light,// for we sing praises to Your glorious Resur<u>rec</u>tion!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

The Prophets bore the fruit of e<u>ter</u>nal life; they prepared the <u>way</u> of the Lord. By their words they proclaimed You; by their deeds they <u>hon</u>ored You: they would not worship creation instead of You, the Cre<u>a</u>tor. As Your Gospel commands, they re<u>nounced</u> the world. They foretold Your Passion by <u>suf</u>fering themselves. Through their <u>prayers</u>, O Lord,// enable us to pass over the battlefield of Lent without sin!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

You are infinite in Your divine nature, O <u>Mas</u>ter; in these latter days You accepted the limi<u>ta</u>tions of the flesh. By assuming our body, You accepted all its <u>weak</u>nesses. Therefore we make <u>images</u> of Your form; we venerate them, having <u>You</u> in mind. We fall down be<u>fore</u> You in love; by so doing we follow the tradition of the A<u>pos</u>tles// and are given the grace of healing.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Today the Church of Christ receives honorable a<u>dorn</u>ment: the holy icons of Christ our Savior, the Theotokos, and <u>all</u> the Saints. The Church ex<u>ults</u> in their grace! We lift them up with joy and <u>glad</u>ness! We glorify God, the <u>Lov</u>er of man,// Him Who patiently <u>suf</u>fered for our sake!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and *He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.*

Tone 2[†] (from the Menaion, for the Holy 40 Martyrs, by John the Monk)

The holy Martyrs bravely endured their present <u>suffering</u>; they rejoiced in things hoped for but <u>not</u> yet seen. They <u>said</u> to each <u>oth</u>er: "By stripping off our garments we have put off the <u>old</u> man. The winter is cold and bitter, but Paradise will be <u>warm</u> and sweet. The <u>freez</u>ing is painful, but the reward will <u>bring</u> us joy. Let us not be defeated, O <u>broth</u>ers! We suffer a little, but Christ will crown us with the laurel of <u>vic</u>tory.// He is our God and the Savior of our souls."

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

The holy Martyrs threw their <u>clothes</u> aside; fearlessly they entered the lake and encouraged one an<u>other</u>: "Re<u>mem</u>ber that our fallen nature has been deprived of <u>Par</u>adise! Let us care nothing for our corruptible <u>flesh</u> today! The serpent once deceived us, handing over our <u>bod</u>ies to death; now <u>let</u> us win resur<u>rec</u>tion for all! Let us scorn the ice and cold; let us <u>hate</u> our flesh, and Christ will crown us with the laurel of <u>vic</u>tory!// He is our God and the <u>Savior</u> of our souls."

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

The holy Martyrs accepted their <u>tor</u>ments with joy. They hurried to the frozen lake as to a <u>com</u>forting bath. They <u>said</u>: "We will not fear the <u>bitter cold</u>. Only let us escape Ge<u>hen</u>na's flames! Let a foot be burned, that it may rejoice e<u>ter</u>nally! Let a <u>hand</u> be lost, offered to the Lord in <u>sac</u>rifice! Let us not refuse <u>death</u> in the flesh! Embrace death, and Christ will crown us with the laurel of <u>vic</u>tory!// He is our God, and the <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls."

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 2 (from the Lenten Triodion)

Grace and truth have shone forth.

The predictions of old have been <u>clear</u>ly fulfilled. Be<u>hold</u>, the Church adorns herself with the form of Christ in<u>car</u>nate! The icons of the new creation transcend the a<u>dorn</u>ments of the old. As the Ark of the Covenant held the <u>presence</u> of God, so <u>now</u> the icons reveal the presence of the <u>One</u> we adore. By honoring them we will <u>never</u> go astray. It is our glory to fall down and worship <u>Christ</u> in the flesh. <u>Come</u>, O faithful, venerate His <u>im</u>age and cry out:// O Lord, save Your people, and bless Your in<u>heritance</u>!

Tone 4 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

The Prophet David was a <u>fa</u>ther of the Lord through you, O <u>Virgin</u>. He fore<u>told</u> in songs the One Who worked <u>won</u>der in you: "At Your right hand <u>stood</u> the Queen," Your Mother, the medi<u>at</u>rix of life, since God was freely born of her without a <u>fa</u>ther. He wanted to renew His fallen image, made corrupt in <u>passion</u>, so He took the lost sheep up<u>on</u> His <u>shoul</u>der and brought it to His <u>Fa</u>ther, joining it to the <u>heav</u>enly pow'rs.// Christ, Who has great and rich mercy, has saved the world, O Theo<u>to</u>kos.

Tone 4(for the Resurrection)

By ascending the <u>Cross</u>, O Lord, You have annulled our an<u>ces</u>tral curse. By de<u>scend</u>ing to hell, You have freed the eternal <u>pris</u>oners, granting incorruption to the <u>hu</u>man race.// Therefore in songs we glorify Your life-creating and saving Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

By hanging upon the tree, O only <u>pow</u>erful Lord, You shook all of cre<u>a</u>tion. By being <u>laid</u> in the tomb You have raised those who <u>dwelt</u> in the tombs, granting life and incorruption to the <u>hu</u>man race.// Therefore in songs we glorify Your rising on the <u>third</u> day.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

The lawless <u>people</u>, O Christ, handed You over to Pilate, condemned to be <u>cru</u>cified, thus <u>prov</u>ing themselves ungrateful before their <u>Ben</u>efactor. But voluntarily You endured <u>bur</u>ial, rising by Your own power on the <u>third</u> day as God,// granting us life everlasting and great <u>mer</u>cy.

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

With tears the women <u>reached</u> Your tomb, searching for You, but not <u>find</u>ing You. They <u>wept</u> with wailing and la<u>ment</u>ed: "Woe to us! Our Savior, <u>King</u> of all, <u>how</u> were You <u>sto</u>len? What place can hold Your life-bearing <u>body</u>?" An Angel re<u>plied</u> to them: "Do not weep, but go and proclaim that the <u>Lord</u> is <u>risen</u>,// granting us joy as the only com<u>pas</u>sionate One!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 6 (from the Menaion, for the Holy 40 Martyrs)

O faithful, let us praise the forty passion-bearing Martyrs in hymns! Singing in harmony let us cry out to them saying: "Rejoice, O sufferers of Christ: Hesýchius, Méliton, Heráclius, Smarágdus and Domnus; Euónicus, Válens and Vivianus; Claudius and Priscus! Rejoice, Theódulus, Euthýchius and John, Xanthéas, Hiliánus, Sisínius, Kýrion, Angíus, Aétius and Flavius! Rejoice, Acácius, Ecdíkius, Lysimáchus, Alexander, Elías and Candidus, Theophilus, Dométian and Gáius with the Godly Gorgonius! Rejoice, Leóntius and Athanasius, Cýril and Sacerdon, Nicholas and Valerius, Philóctimon, Sevérian, Chudíon and Aglaius! You have boldness before Christ our God, most honored Martyrs. Beseech Him earnestly// that those who keep your most precious memory with faith may be saved!

Tone 2 (from the Lenten Triodion)

Advancing from false doctrine to <u>true</u> faith, illumined with the light of <u>know</u>ledge, let us <u>clap</u> our hands and offer grateful praise to <u>God</u> in song! With due honor let us venerate the holy <u>icons</u> of Christ, of the all-pure Virgin, and of <u>all</u> the saints, de<u>picted</u> on walls or panels or sacred <u>ves</u>sels, rejecting the godless teaching of the <u>her</u>etics! For as Saint <u>Bas</u>il says: "The <u>hon</u>or shown to the image passes to its <u>pro</u>totype." By the prayers of Your pure Mother and of <u>all</u> the saints,// we beseech You, O Christ our God, to <u>grant</u> us great <u>mercy</u>! (at Great Vespers)

Tone 4 Troparion (*Resurrection*)

When the women disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the joyous message of Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, they cast away the an<u>ces</u>tral curse and elatedly told the a<u>pos</u>tles: "<u>Death</u> is overthrown! Christ God is <u>ris</u>en,// granting the world great <u>mer</u>cy!"

My Savior and Re<u>deem</u>er as God rose from the tomb and delivered the <u>earth</u>-born from their chains. He has shattered the <u>gates</u> of hell, and as <u>Mas</u>ter,// He has risen on the <u>third</u> day!

Tone 6 Kontakion (Holy 40 Martyrs)

You have abandoned all earthly <u>armies</u>, cleaving to the heavenly Master, O Forty <u>Mar</u>tyrs of the Lord. Having passed through fire and water, O <u>bless</u>ed ones,// you have fittingly received heavenly glory and <u>many</u> crowns.

Tone 8Kontakion (Sunday of Orthodoxy)

No one could describe the Word of the Father;

but when He took <u>flesh</u> from <u>you</u>, O Theotokos, He accepted to <u>be</u> described, and restored the <u>fal</u>len <u>im</u>age to its former state by uniting it to divine <u>beauty</u>.// We confess and pro<u>claim</u> our sal<u>va</u>tion in words and <u>im</u>ages.

Tone 4Prokeimenon(Song of the Fathers)

Blessed are You, O Lord God of our fathers, / and praised and glorified is Your Name forever! (*Song of the three Holy Children, v. 3*)

V. For You are just in all that You have done for us! (v. 4)

Tone 5Prokeimenon(Holy 40 Martyrs)

You, O Lord, shall protect us / and preserve us from this generation forever. (*Ps.* 11:7)

Epistle (329-ctr) Hebrews 11:24-26; 32-12:2 (331) Hebrews 12:1-10 (*Holy 40 Martyrs*)

Tone 4

Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

V. Moses and Aaron were among His priests; Samuel also was among those who called on His Name. (*Ps.* 98:6)
