#### "Lord I Call..." Tone 5

Lord, I call upon You, hear me! Hear me, O Lord!
Lord, I call upon You, hear me!
Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon You!//
Hear me, O Lord!

Let my prayer arise in Your sight as incense, and let the lifting up of my hands be an evening sacrifice!//
Hear me, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name! V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

## **Tone 5** *(for the Resurrection)*

By Your <u>pre</u>cious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, You have put the <u>dev</u>il to shame. By Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, You have blunted the <u>sting</u> of sin and <u>saved</u> us from the <u>gates</u> of death.// We glorify You, O <u>on</u>ly begotten One.

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

<u>Christ</u> was led as a sheep to the <u>slaughter</u> in order to grant Resurrection to the <u>human race</u>. The <u>princes</u> of hell were <u>fright</u>ened by this, for the <u>gates</u> of sorrow were <u>lift</u>ed. Christ the King of glory had <u>en</u>tered, <u>say</u>ing to those in <u>chains</u>: "Go forth!"// And to those in <u>darkness</u>: "Come to the light!"

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

O great wonder!

The Creator of the invisible suffered in the flesh in His <u>love</u> for man and <u>rose</u> again immortal.

Come, O sons of nations,

let us worship Him,

for delivered from error by His compassion,//

we have learned to sing of one <u>God</u> in three <u>Per</u>sons!

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

We offer You our evening worship,

O never setting Light,

Who <u>came</u> in these last days to the <u>world</u> in the flesh;

Who even descended to hell to dispel its darkness.

Who has revealed the light of Resurrection to the <u>na</u>tions.//

Glory to You, O Lord and Giver of light!

**V.** (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

We glorify the Leader of our salvation;

by His Resurrection from the dead,

the world was saved from deceit.

The assembly of Angels rejoices

as the deceit of demons is overthrown.//

Fallen Adam <u>rises</u> as the <u>devil</u> falls.

**V.** (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

The <u>guards</u> were instructed by the <u>law</u>less ones:

"Hide the rising of Christ, take <u>mon</u>ey and say:

'The <u>body</u> was stolen from the tomb while <u>we</u> were asleep.'"

But who has heard of a body being stolen,

a body embalmed and naked,

with its grave clothes left behind in the tomb?

Do not be deceived, O Jews,

study the words of the Prophets and understand://

Christ is the Redeemer of the world and all powerful!

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

### **Tone 2**\* (from the Lenten Triodion) (With what crowns)

What hymns of praise shall we sing to honor the holy <u>bish</u>op? He is the trumpet of theology, the flaming <u>mouth</u>piece of grace, the chosen <u>ves</u>sel of the Spirit, the unshakeable <u>pil</u>lar of the Church, the great joy of the in<u>hab</u>ited earth, the river of wisdom, the <u>can</u>dlestick of the Light,// the shining star that has made all creation bright.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

What garlands of song shall we weave for the holy <u>bish</u>op? He is the champion of true worship, the foe of ungodliness, the <u>fer</u>vent de<u>fend</u>er of the faith, the great guide and teacher, the well-tuned harp of the <u>Spir</u>it, the golden tongue, the fountain flowing with healing for the <u>faithful</u>,// the great and wonderful <u>Greg</u>ory.

**V.** (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

How shall we who dwell on earth praise the holy <u>bishop?</u>
He is the Church's teacher, the herald of the Uncreated Light, the in<u>it</u>iate of the Trinity's heavenly <u>mys</u>teries, the adornment of the mo<u>nastic life,</u> renowned alike in action and contem<u>plation</u>, the <u>pride</u> of Thessalonica; And now he dwells in <u>heaven</u> with the great and glorious martyr De<u>met</u>rius,// whose relics flow with <u>ho</u>ly oil.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

# **Tone 6** *(from the Lenten Triodion)*

O thrice-blessed saint, most holy <u>fa</u>ther, good shepherd, disciple of Christ, the Chief <u>Shep</u>herd. Like Him you gave your <u>life</u> for your sheep. By your intercessions, O God-bearing Father <u>Greg</u>ory,//may great mercy be <u>grant</u>ed to our souls!

## **Tone 5** (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

In the Red Sea of old, a type of the Virgin Bride was prefigured. There Moses divided the waters; here Gabriel assisted in the miracle. There Israel crossed the sea without getting wet, here the Virgin gave birth to Christ without seed. After Israel's passage, the sea remained impassable; after Emmanuel's birth, the Virgin remained a Virgin. O ever-existing God Who appeared as Man,//O Lord, have mercy on us!

## **Tone 5** *(for the Resurrection)*

We <u>magnify</u> You in <u>songs</u> of praise,
O incarnate Christ and <u>Sav</u>ior.
By ac<u>cepting</u> the Cross and <u>death</u> for our sake, as the <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lover</u> of man,
You overthrew the <u>gates</u> of hell,//
and arose on the <u>third</u> day, <u>sav</u>ing our souls.

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

By being <u>pierced</u> in the side, O <u>Lover</u> of man,
You have poured out drops of life and sal<u>va</u>tion for all.
By ac<u>cepting</u> death in the flesh, You have granted us immor<u>tal</u>ity.
You have <u>freed</u> us by being <u>placed</u> in the tomb,
and have resurrected us with Yourself in <u>glory</u>, as God.//
Glory to You, O <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lover</u> of man!

**V**. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Your crucifixion and descent into hell are awesome, O <u>Lov</u>er of man. You have captured it, releasing the ancient <u>pris</u>oners. You have <u>opened Paradise</u> and <u>giv</u>en it to us. <u>Grant</u> us purification of sins, who glorify Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day! Make us <u>wor</u>thy of <u>Paradise</u>// and <u>save</u> us, O <u>Lov</u>er of man!

**V**. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

For our <u>sake</u>, You accepted <u>death</u> in the flesh, to rise from the dead on the <u>third</u> day. <u>Heal</u> us from our earthly <u>passions</u>, and re<u>store</u> us from our evil trans<u>gressions</u>;// and save us, O Lover of man!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

### **Tone 8** *(from the Lenten Triodion)*

Your tongue, watchful in teaching, rings in the ears of our hearts, and awakens the souls of the slothful.
Your words are inspired by God; they are a ladder leading us from earth to heaven.
O Gregory, pride of Thessalonica, do not cease to intercede before Christ our God//to illumine with His Divine Light those who honor you!

### Tone 8 (Theotokion)

O unwedded Virgin, who ineffably conceived <u>God</u> in the flesh, O <u>Mother of God</u> most high, accept the cries of your servants, O <u>blame</u>less One! Grant cleansing of transgressions to all!// Receive our prayers and pray to save our souls!

Reveal Your <u>love</u> for <u>man</u>, O Merciful One, and accept the Theotokos <u>pray</u>ing for us,//

"Our sins are more in number than the <u>sands</u> of the sea;
but forgive us, O <u>Mas</u>ter of all,//
so that we may receive the incor<u>ruptible</u> crowns!"

You, O Lord, shall protect us / and preserve us from this generation forever. (*Ps. 11:7*)

V. Save me, O Lord, for there is no longer any that is godly! (Ps. 11:1a)

# Tone 1 Prokeimenon (St. Gregory Palamas)

My mouth shall speak wisdom; / the meditation of my heart shall be understanding. (Ps. 48:3)
