TONE 6

Third Sunday of Great Lent, Veneration of the Cross

"Lord I Call..." Tone 6

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear me, O Lord!

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!

Tone 6 *(for the Resurrection)*

Possessing victory over <u>hell</u>, O Christ, since You are <u>free</u> among the dead, You as<u>cended</u> the Cross raising with Yourself those who sat in the <u>shades</u> of death.// Drawing life from Your light, O almighty Savior, have mercy on us!

V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

Today Christ <u>tram</u>ples on death, for He is <u>risen</u> as He said!
Let us all <u>sing</u> this song, for He has granted <u>joy</u> to the world:
O Light unapproachable, O <u>Foun</u>tain of life!//
O Savior almighty, have mercy on us!

V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

Where shall we sinners flee from You, Who are in all creation? In heaven You dwell! In hell You trampled on death! In the depths of the sea? Even there is Your hand, O Master! To You we flee, and falling before You, we pray:// O You Who rose from the dead, have mercy on us!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

(Resurrection stichera by Anatolius)

In Your Cross, we <u>glo</u>ry, O Christ. We sing and glorify Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion. For <u>You</u> are our God,// and we know no other than You.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

We will always <u>bless</u> the Lord by singing of His Resur<u>rec</u>tion! For He en<u>dured</u> the Cross,// trampling down <u>death</u> by death.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Glory to Your <u>might</u>, O Lord, for You overthrew the <u>prince</u> of death, by Your Cross re<u>newing us</u>,// granting us life and incor<u>rup</u>tion.

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

Tone 5* (from the Lenten Triodion) (Rejoice, O Life-bearing Cross)

Shine, O Cross of the Lord!

Illumine the hearts of those who honor you!

With love inspired by God, we embrace you, for you are the only hope of the world.

Through you our tears are wiped away, the snares of death are sprung, and we pass over into everlasting joy.

Through the Cross reveal Your beauty to us, O Lord!

Help Your servants who ask for mercy in faith!//

Bestow upon us the fruits of abstinence!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

bright paradise of the Church, the tree of incor<u>rup</u>tion!
You have ob<u>tained</u> for us the joy of everlasting <u>glo</u>ry.
Through <u>you</u>, the hosts of demons are <u>driv</u>en out;
the choirs of angels are a<u>mazed</u> and rejoice;

The <u>Cross</u> is the <u>might</u> of the Church, through which corruption is a<u>bol</u>ished, through <u>which</u> the power of <u>death</u> is crushed, and we are <u>raised</u> from earth to <u>hea</u>ven.
O invincible weapon, the adversary of <u>de</u>mons, the <u>glory</u> of martyrs, the true adornment of <u>ven</u>'rable saints, and the <u>ha</u>ven of sal<u>va</u>tion,// which grants the <u>world</u> great <u>me</u>rcy.

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Come, O Adam and Eve, our first father and mother, who fell from divine glory through the envy of the murderer of man!

Bitter was the pleasure of the Tree of old; but see, the honored Tree of the Cross draws near!

Run with haste and embrace it in joy, crying out with faith:

"You are our help, O most-precious Cross!

We eat your fruit and gain incorruption!//
We are restored again to Eden, having received great mercy!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Tone 3 *(from the Lenten Triodion)*

Wishing to restore <u>all</u> men to life,
You accepted crucifixion, O <u>Christ</u> our God.
Burning with boundless <u>love</u> for man,
You took the quill of the <u>Cross</u> in Your hand;
dipping it in ink of royal <u>crim</u>son,
You signed our release with blood-stained <u>fingers</u>.
Though temptations as <u>sault</u> us,
may we never for <u>sake</u> You again!
Have mercy on Your despairing <u>people</u>,
O long-suffering <u>Mas</u>ter!//
Arise and fight Your enemies in Your almighty power!

Tone 6 (*Theotokion – Dogmatikon*)

Who will not bless you, O most holy <u>Virgin?</u>
Who will not sing of your most pure <u>child</u>bearing?
The only-begotten Son shone timelessly from the <u>Fa</u>ther, but from you He was ineffably in<u>car</u>nate.
God by nature, yet <u>Man</u> for our sake, not two persons, but one known in two <u>na</u>tures.
Entreat Him, O pure and all-blessed <u>La</u>dy,//
to have mercy on our souls!

Aposticha

Tone 6 *(for the Resurrection)*

Your Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, the Angels in <u>heav</u>en sing! Enable <u>us</u> on earth// to glorify You in <u>pur</u>ity of heart!

V. The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!

Destroying the <u>gates</u> of hell, breaking the <u>chains</u> of death, You resurrected the fallen human race as al<u>mighty</u> God!// O Lord, Who rose from the dead, glory to You! **V**. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved.

Desiring to return us to Paradise,

Christ was nailed to the Cross and <u>placed</u> in a tomb.

The Myrrhbearing Women sought Him with tears, crying,

"Woe to us, O <u>Savior!</u>

How do You deign to descend to death?

What place can hold Your life bearing body?

Come to us as You promised!

Take away our wailing and tears!"

Then the Angel appeared to them:

"Stop your lamentations!

Go, proclaim to the Apostles:

'The Lord is <u>ris</u>en,//

V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore!

Having been <u>cru</u>cified as You willed, by Your burial You captured <u>death</u>, O Christ, rising on the third day as God in <u>glo</u>ry,// granting the world unending life and great <u>mer</u>cy!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Tone 4 *(from the Lenten Triodion)*

The humble <u>Da</u>vid defeated his enemies by Your <u>help</u>, O Lord.

Now <u>come</u> to the aid of Your Orthodox <u>people</u>; show us Your power as You <u>did</u> of old, and our adversaries will <u>know</u> that <u>You</u> are God!

And we will be victorious, for we <u>hope</u> in You.

Through the constant intercessions of Your all-pure <u>Mother</u>,// grant us Your great <u>mer</u>cy!

(at Great Vespers)

Tone 6 Troparion (Resurrection)

The Angelic <u>Pow</u>ers were at Your tomb; the guards became as <u>dead</u> men.

Mary <u>stood</u> by Your grave, seeking Your most pure <u>body</u>.

Tone 1 Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion

When <u>Ga</u>briel announced to you, O Virgin, saying "Rejoice!" with that word the Master of all was incarnate in <u>you</u>, the holy Ark, spoken of by the righteous <u>Da</u>vid! Your <u>womb</u> became more spacious than the <u>heavens</u>, for you carried your <u>Creator</u>. <u>Glory to Him Who took abode in you!</u> Glory to Him Who came <u>forth</u> from you!// Glory to Him Who freed us by being <u>born</u> of you!

Stichera at the Veneration of the Cross

NOTE: The following stichera are specifically appointed for this occasion. Some, but not all of them, are also appointed to be sung on the feast of the Elevation of the Cross, September 14.

Tone 2 (by Emperor Leo)

Come, O faithful, let us venerate the <u>life</u>-giving Wood on which Christ the King of Glory voluntarily stretched <u>out</u> His hands and raised us <u>up</u> to our <u>ancient bliss</u>, though formerly the enemy had despoiled us through <u>pleasure</u> and made us <u>exiles</u> from God.

<u>Come</u>, O faithful, let us <u>ven</u>erate the Wood through which we have been accounted worthy to crush the heads of our

invisible <u>en</u>emies. Come, all you kindred of the <u>na</u>tions,

let us <u>hon</u>or in hymns the <u>Cross</u> of the Lord:

"Rejoice, O Cross, complete deliverance of fallen Adam!

In you our faithful rulers make their boast,

since by your power they subjugate the people of <u>Ish</u>mael.

As we Christians now kiss you with fear,

we glorify God Who was nailed upon you, and we say:

'O <u>Lord</u>, Who on the Cross were crucified, have <u>mer</u>cy on us,// as You are good and love mankind!'"

Tone 8

To<u>day</u>, the Master of creation and Lord of <u>glory</u> is nailed to the Cross and His <u>side</u> is pierced.

He Who is the sweet drink of the Church tastes <u>gall</u> and <u>vinegar</u>. The One Who crowned the heavens is <u>crowned</u> with thorns; He is vested in a robe of <u>mockery</u>.

The Creator of the earth is <u>struck</u> with <u>human hands</u>. He accepts scourging, spitting, and <u>buf</u>feting, all for the sake of me, as I <u>stand</u> condemned!

He is my God and com<u>passionate Deliverer</u>,//

Who saves the world from deceit!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

Tone 8

Today He Who by nature is unapproachable approaches me. He Who freed me from my passions endures the Passion.

The Light of the blind is spat upon by lawless lips. For the sake of captives He gives His back to scourging.

When His pure Virgin Mother beheld Him on the Cross, she cried in pain: "Woe is me, O my Child! What have You done? Your beauty was fairer than that of any man, yet now You appear lifeless, without form or comeliness.

Woe is me, O my Light!

I cannot bear to see You sleeping.

My soul is wounded, for a sword has pierced my heart, and yet I praise Your Passion.

I bow down before Your compassion.//
O long-suffering Lord, glory to You!"

Tone 7 Kontakion (Cross)

Now the <u>flaming</u> sword no longer guards the gates of <u>Eden</u>; it has been mysteriously quenched by the <u>wood</u> of the Cross. The <u>sting</u> of death and the victory of hell have been <u>van</u>quished; for You, O my Savior, have come and cried to <u>those</u> in hell:// "Enter again into <u>Par</u>adise!"

(Instead of the Trisagion, we sing:)

Before Your Cross, we bow down in worship, O Master, and Your holy Resurrection we glorify.

O Lord, save Your people, / and bless Your inheritance! (Ps. 27:9a)

V. To You, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent to me! (Ps. 27:1a)
