#### MARCH 25/26

The Annunciation of our Most Holy Lady Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary [Synaxis of the Archangel Gabriel]
Vespers with the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom

Note: Because it is the Week of the Cross, the Service to the Archangel Gabriel is set aside and said at Compline or on another day.

#### "Lord I Call..." Tone 3

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord. Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me. Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You.// Hear me, O Lord.

Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>incense</u>, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice.// Hear me, O Lord.

- **V.** (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name!
- V. (9) The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.
- V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!

# **Tone 3** *Idiomelon* (from the Lenten Triodion)

I surpass the Publican in transgressions, but do not even compete in his repentance.

I have not accomplished the good deeds of the Pharisee, yet I boldly out-do his boasting.

By Your infinite humility, O Christ God, through which You laid low the high-minded demons on the Cross, establish in me the good deeds of the one and the humility of mind of the other, confirming in me the good intentions of each,// and save me, O Savior!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

### **Tone 3** *(for the Martyrs)*

The Prophets, Apostles, and <u>mar</u>tyrs of Christ have taught mankind to praise the consubstantial <u>Trin</u>ity. They have given light to the nations that had <u>gone</u> astray// and have made the sons of men companions of the <u>Ang</u>els.

**V.** (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

**Tone 6** (from the Lenten Triodion, for the Cross) (Having placed all their hope)

You endured the Cross and <u>Passion</u> in the midst of the earth, O <u>mer</u>ciful Lord, granting all men redemption and freedom from <u>passions</u>. Therefore on the middle <u>day</u> of the Fast, we set Your Cross before us and venerate it with rejoicing. Glorious with the light of divine <u>vir</u>tues, may we be counted worthy to see Your Passion and life-giving Resur<u>rec</u>tion,//O only merciful <u>Word</u> of God.

**V.** (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

Nailed up<u>on</u> the Cross,
Your side <u>pierced</u> with a spear,
You were counted as a <u>life</u>less corpse
and given gall to drink, O long-suffering <u>Mas</u>ter,
Who sweetened the waters of Marah by the hand of <u>Mo</u>ses.
Therefore I en<u>treat</u> You and pray:
"Uproot the bitter passions from my under<u>standing</u>,
sweeten my mind with the honey of re<u>pent</u>ance,//
and grant that I may worship at Your holy <u>Pas</u>sion!"

**V.** (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord!

### **Tone 1** (from the Lenten Triodion, for the Cross) (He Who once spoke to Moses)

To<u>day</u> we see the mighty Cross placed be<u>fore</u> us which Moses once prefigured with out<u>stretched</u> arms, as <u>he</u> put <u>A</u>malek to flight.

O peoples, trembling, let us <u>touch</u> it with pure <u>minds</u> and lips, for <u>Christ</u> was raised up on it when He <u>slew</u> death.

May we all be counted <u>wor</u>thy of His grace, and, <u>praising</u> the Savior of all with hymns in<u>spired</u> by God,//let us pray that we may come to His saving Resur<u>rec</u>tion!

**V.** (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

#### **Tone 4** *Idiomela (from the Menaion, for the Feast)*

In the sixth month, the Archangel was sent to the pure <u>Virgin</u>; and with his <u>greeting</u> "Rejoice," he an<u>nounced</u> the good news that the Deliverer was to come <u>forth</u> from her. Therefore, having received the salu<u>tation</u> with faith, she conceived You, the <u>pre-eternal God</u>, Who were well-pleased ineffably to be<u>come man//</u> for the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls.

### V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

The Theotokos heard a tongue that <u>she</u> knew not, for the Archangel addressed to her the words of glad <u>tidings</u>; therefore, accepting the salu<u>tation</u> with faith, she conceived You, the pre-e<u>ter</u>nal God. And so, rejoicing exceedingly, we <u>too</u> cry a<u>loud</u> to You: O God, made flesh from <u>her</u> without change,// grant peace to the world, and great <u>mer</u>cy to our souls!

**V.** (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever.

Behold, our restoration has now been re<u>vealed</u> to us: in a manner beyond understanding, God is united to mankind; at the <u>voice</u> of the Archangel, de<u>lusion</u> is destroyed, for the Virgin re<u>ceives</u> joy; things of the earth have be<u>come heaven</u>; and the world is freed from the <u>ancient curse</u>. Let creation rejoice exceedingly and sing with <u>voi</u>ces of praise:// "O Lord, our Maker and Deliverer, glory to You!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

# **Tone 8** *Idiomelon* (from the Lenten Triodion)

To<u>day</u>, the Master of creation and Lord of <u>glory</u> is nailed to the Cross and His <u>side</u> is pierced.

He Who is the sweet drink of the Church tastes <u>gall</u> and <u>vinegar</u>. The One Who crowned the heavens is <u>crowned</u> with thorns; He is vested in a robe of <u>mockery</u>.

The Creator of the earth is <u>struck</u> with <u>human hands</u>. He accepts scourging, spitting, and <u>buf</u>feting, all for the sake of me, as I <u>stand</u> condemned!

He is my God and com<u>passionate Deliverer</u>,//

Who saves the world from deceit!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

## **Tone 6** *(for the Feast, by John the Monk)*

The Archangel Gabriel was sent from <u>heav</u>en, to announce to the Virgin the good news of her con<u>ceiv</u>ing. And coming to Nazareth, he was filled with wonder at the <u>mir</u>acle, and reasoned within himself:

"How is it that He Who dwells on high, Whom none can <u>com</u>prehend, is to be born of a <u>Virgin?</u>

How is He, Whose throne is Heaven and Whose <u>foot</u>stool is the earth, to be contained in the womb of a <u>wom</u>an?

He upon Whom the six-winged Seraphim and the many-eyed Cherubim are not <u>a</u>ble to gaze

is well-pleased to be made flesh from her at a <u>sing</u>le word.

It is the Word of <u>God</u> Who is to come.

Why then do I hesitate, and not say to the <u>Maid</u>en:

'Rejoice, O Lady, full of grace, the Lord is with you!

Rejoice, pure Virgin!

Rejoice, Bride without Bridegroom!

Rejoice, Mother of the Life!//

Blessed is the Fruit of your womb!""

#### Tone 6 Prokeimenon

Sing to God, sing praises to His name; / lift up a sing to Him Who rides upon the clouds! (*Ps.* 67:4*a-b*)

**V**. His Name is the Lord, exult before Him! (Ps.67:4c)

### Reading from Genesis (9:8-17)

#### Tone 6 Prokeimenon

I am afflicted and in pain; / let Your salvation, O God, set me on high. (Ps. 68:34)

**V.** Let the oppressed see it and be glad; you who see God, let your hearts revive! (Ps. 68:37)

## Reading from Proverbs (12:8-22)

And two readings for the Feast:

Old Testament Readings Exodus 3:1-8 (*Theotokos*) Proverbs 8:22-30 (*Theotokos*)

The readings are followed by the Little Litany and the Trisagion, and the rest of the Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom.

#### Tone 4 Prokeimenon (Annunciation)

From day to day / proclaim the salvation of our God! (Ps. 95:2a)

V. Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth! (Ps. 95:1)

# **Epistle**

(306) Hebrews 2:11-18 (Annunciation)

#### Tone 1

Alleluia, Alleluia!

- **V**. He descends like rain upon the fleece, like raindrops that water the earth. (Ps. 71:6)
- **V.** May His Name be blessed forever; may His Name continue as long as the sun! (*Ps.* 71:17)

### Gospel

(3) Luke 1:24-38 (Annunciation)

(Instead of "It is truly meet...," we sing:)

## The Hymn to the Theotokos

O earth, announce good tidings of great joy: O heavens, praise the glory of God!

Since she is a living Ark of God let no profane hand touch the Theotokos. But let the lips of believers unceasingly sing to her, praising her in joy with the angel's song: "Rejoice, O Lady, full of grace, the Lord is with you!"
