Tone 7 Idiomelon (from the Lenten Triodion)

Like the <u>Prodigal</u>, I have turned a<u>way</u> from Your grace. I have <u>spent</u> the riches of Your <u>good</u>ness, O Lord. I now <u>run</u> to You, crying, O tender-<u>heart</u>ed One:// I have sinned, O God, have <u>mer</u>cy on me!

v. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 6 *(for the Martyrs, from the Octoechos in the Tone of the week)*

Walking in the steps of Christ's <u>sufferings</u>, the whole company of martyrs resolutely approached their many <u>struggles</u>, and proclaimed Him as God before the ungodly torturers and <u>law</u>less kings; and they endured many <u>tor</u>ments

in the hope of obtaining the glories of <u>heaven</u>. Seeing them <u>now</u>, they rejoice, and with all the choirs of the <u>bodiless</u> hosts,// they stand in the <u>presence</u> of the Lord.

Your Martyrs, O Lord, did not deny You, nor did they turn from Your commandments.//
By their intercessions have mercy on us!

v. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch let Israel hope on the Lord!

Your victorious Martyrs, when they contended on this earth, endured great torments; but now they dwell in heaven and have received a perfect crown,//that they may offer intercession for our souls.

v. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Tone 4* (for St. James, from the Menaion) (Thou hast given a sign)

You desired the glory that is eternal and does not <u>pass</u> away, scorning the glory that is transitory and <u>perishing</u>.

You took <u>up</u> your cross and follow after the <u>cru</u>cified One, subjecting your flesh to ascetic <u>struggles</u>.//
Therefore, O James, we celebrate your <u>mem</u>ory.

v. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

You were crucified to the world and to the <u>passions</u>, preserving your soul unde<u>filed</u> and pure, un<u>taint</u>ed by low things, O <u>Father James</u>.

Thus you soared to the heavens with mystical <u>visions</u>.

There you set forth your life as a <u>true friend</u> of Christ,// O ever-memorable one and a most <u>faithful</u> saint.
