<u>Ascetical Fast Preparation</u>: Our church assists us in preparing for the upcoming ascetical fast that is an integral part of our Lenten journey. In brief, here is the schedule related to fasting for the coming weeks:

Week of Feb. 16: back to regular fasting Wednesday and Friday

Sunday, Feb. 23: Meatfare Sunday, last day to eat meat, dairy products allowed all week Sunday, March 2: Cheesefare Sunday, last day to eat dairy products. **Forgiveness Vespers**

Monday, March 3: Great Lent begins with Clean Week (Triodion, p. 35)

Please begin planning <u>now</u> for the beginning of Great Lent: **Forgiveness Sunday Vespers** will be celebrated on **March 2**nd after coffee hour. We begin the first week of the Great Lenten journey with the celebration of the Service of **Great Compline and the Canon of St. Andrew**. This service is integral to our entrance into Great Lent. Please make every effort to attend these services.

St. Polycarp, Bishop of Smyrna:

Is a pivotal figure in the early church: a disciple of St. John the Theologian who appointed him to Smyrna; who encountered St. Ignatius of Antioch who visited him; and who St. Irenaeus met as a child! "All the information we possess about Polycarp lauds him as a stellar exemplar of Christian faith, life, and death." *Polycarpos* means "much fruit". The prayer that Polycarp prays before his martyrdom is full of Biblical language. "Polycarp blesses God for having: 'thought me worthy of this day and this hour to be numbered among your martyrs in the cup of your Christ, for the resurrection of eternal life, of both soul and body, in the incorruptibility of the Holy Spirit. Among these may I be received today before you, in the sacrifice that is rich and acceptable." The author references the incorruptibility given through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit ascribed to the early martyrs, and "in the cup" both to the liturgical practice of the church and the death of Jesus embodied in the eucharistic cup."
